

9 Killed in Separate Incidents of Violence

FIROZKOH - Nine people have been killed in two separate incidents of violence in western Ghor province, officials said on Tuesday.

Two illegal commander's kidnapped six men accused of killing an education officer, who was relative of one of the commanders, in the Shahark district, killing three men in captivity, a security official said on condition of anonymity.

The kidnapped men had allegedly killed Abdul Tawab, the district education officer, in Kaminj area of the district on Friday last.

Illegal commanders Mullah Mustafa and Mullah Mahmoud captured the six men and shot dead three of them and held the remaining three hostage.

The official said the Kaminj area was a stronghold of Mullah Mustafa, who cut off telephone service lines on Monday when the three suspects were killed.

"We tried to gain custody of the suspects and produce them in a government court, but failed," the source said.

A local resident, wishing not to be named, said the three men were killed in an area where security posts also existed. He said the commander of the posts was a brother of Mullah Mustafa and the government had no control over them.

Ghor governor's spokesman Abdul Hai Khatibi condemned the unlawful killings and vowed a judicial inquiry. He said security forces had arrested two persons in connection with the triple murder in Firozkoh, the capital of Ghor.

Taliban Confirm Beheading Soldiers in Juram



FAIZABAD - The Taliban on Tuesday confirmed beheading some Afghan National Army soldiers during attacks on their posts two weeks back in northeastern Badakhshan province, saying it was in revenge for mutilating bodies of slain fighters.

Local officials said the brazen attack from insurgents in Jurm district left at 27 ANA soldiers dead, including eight who were beheaded.

Woman, Man Killed over 'Sexual Relationship'

KABUL - A man shot dead his brother's wife and another man after accusing them of having a sexual relationship in the Sarobi district of central Kabul province on Monday, police said.

Sarobi police chief Col. Mir Salam Adamkhel the incident took place in the centre of the district at around 4pm. The man, Tila Mohammad, shot dead his brother's wife and another man, Faiz Mohammad, inside his home.

He said Tila Mohammad had himself informed the police about the double murder. Police reached the scene and sent the corpses for a post-mortem examination before handing the bodies over to their respective families, Adamkhel said. ...*(More on P4)...(24)*

Blast in Kandahar Leaves 2 Dead, 21 Injured

KANDAHAR - Hospital officials have confirmed that at least two civilians were killed and 21 others, including civilians, were injured in a blast in Kandahar province on Tuesday morning. According to the officials eight police and 13 civilians were injured. NDS Chief of Kandahar Police Rahmatullah Atrafi confirmed the incident and said it took place in the Police District 8 area. Police apparently found the explosive in the area and took it to their offices where it detonated before they could defuse it. According to Atrafi, some of the injured are in serious condition. Kunduz Blast Leaves 1 Dead, 5 Wounded

KUNDUZ CITY - A civilian was killed and five others including a woman wounded in a powerful bomb blast in Kunduz City, officials said on Tuesday.

Sayed Sarwar Husseini, provincial police spokesman, told Pajhwok Afghan News the explosion took place at around 4:30 pm.

Abdul Ali, a shopkeeper, said a shoemaker was killed in the blast and five more including two policemen were wounded.

Husseini, however, rejected that policemen were among the injured. No group so far claimed responsibility for the blast. (Pajhwok)

6 Would-Be Suicide Bombers Held

JALALABAD - At least six would-be suicide bombers and organizers were arrested in eastern Nangarhar province on Tuesday, the spy service said. According to a statement from the National Directorate of Security (NDS), the six-member group was detained in Ghani Khail district of the province.

Qari Rahmatullah known as Qari Usman who was the ringleader of the group along with five others detained during a special operation in 27-Weyali area of the district.

The arrested men included Abdul Bari, Sher Afzal, Shamshad, Samar Gul and Mirwais who were planning to carry out suicide attacks in the province. Suicide vests, Afghan National Army (ANA) soldier uniforms and explosives were also seized from the detainees, the statement added.

The rebels have arrested after a suicide attack in Jalalabad city, the capital of Nangarhar, left 35 people dead and 125 others wounded last Saturday. (Pajhwok)

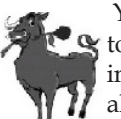
