KABUL - German Defense Minister (DM), Ursula von der Leyen, has emphasized the country's commitment to its mission in Afghanistan while visiting troops here in Afghanistan on Sunday.

Berlin recently announced it was expanding the scope of the mission.

"The basic message must be: We're staying," she said on board the plane heading to Mazar-i-Sharif, where 1,500 NATO soldiers, most of them German, are stationed.

Von der Leyen was travelling there for her traditional holiday visit with German soldiers stationed in the war-torn Central Asian country.

"The presence of ISIL in Afghanistan can quickly spread to other Central Asian countries, including Tajikistan, Kyrgyzstan and Kazakhstan," President of the Russian-American University Alexey Podberezkin said on Monday. Podberezkin's statements came after a group of 1,600 ISIL Takfiri terrorists captured some regions in the Eastern parts of Afghanistan.

In September, the Tajik interior ministry announced that four militants were killed, 17 others were detained and 3 surrendered in a counter-terrorism operation in the Ramitskoye mountain gorge in Tajikistan.(FNA)

KABUL - President Ashraf Ghani said on Monday afternoon that there is no evidence to prove the Taliban leader Mullah Akhtar Mansour is dead.

Speaking at a press conference, Ghani said: "There is no evidence that Mullah Mansour might have been killed. The incident that occurred must be carefully studied," Ghani said referring to the reported clash between two Taliban factions in Quetta, Pakistan last week.

Mahmoud Vaezi Iran, Afghanistan to Sign Agreement on ICT

TEHRAN - Iranian Minister of Communications and Information Technology (CIT) Mahmoud Vaezi said on Monday that Iran and Afghanistan are set to sign a cooperation document on Information and Communications Technology

Vaezi made the remarks after a meeting with the visiting Afghan Minister of Communications and Information Technology Abdul Razaq Wahidi. Vaezi said that there are abundant common grounds between Iran and Afghanistan to pave the way for cooperation in all areas, particularly information and communications technology. counterpart as positive, Vaezi said that they agreed that cooperation between Iranian and Afghan cellphone operators have to be continued as a large part of Iran's international traffic is related to telecom links of the Afghan na-

tionals living in Iran. He said that during his stay in Tehran, the Afghan minister will hold meetings with officials from Iranian private sector companies to review how to cooperate on hardware and software

ISIL Captures Afghanistan Districts to Create New 'Province'

DUSHANBE - The Sunday Telegraph reported that the Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant (ISIL) has invaded swaths of Afghanistan, capturing a number of areas.

The terror group is said to hold four districts south of Jalalabad as part of its drive to establish a new province for its self-style "caliphate." Pictures posted by militants on social media show a training camp in the mountain of eastern Afghanistan, where an ISIL 'province' spans the border with Pakistan. The group's self-declared Khorasan province is in the area of Afghanistan that was once al-Oaeda's heartland.

Radical groups, including

the Haqqani network and factions of the Taliban, have declared allegiance to ISIL. Most of the self-declared ISL groups in Afghanistan are believed to be made up of disaffected Taliban members who have pledged allegiance to Baghdadi, often fro propaganda or fundraising purposes. Formal links with the ISIL leadership in Syria and Iraq have been difficult to prove, The Sunday Telegraph said.

The Times reported on December 5 that up to 1,600 fighters are involved with the surge, which is driven by ISILs regional affiliate, Wilayat Khorasan.

Journalist Lost 4-Month-Old Child on Europe-Bound Boat

ANKARA - The tragic story of an Afghan journalist couple who lost their 4-month-old baby on the way to Europe has sent shockwaves across Afghanistan, reminding the painful tragedy of the Syrian child Aylan Al-Kurdi who washed up on a Turkish beach three months ago.

The harrowing story of the journalist Afghan couple, Qais Rahmani and his family emerged from Turkey this week following the deadly incident while they were trying to illegally cross into Europe using the Turkish beach.

In a video call with a private TV channel in Afghanistan, Rahmani shared his experience regarding his horrific journey to Europe. "The situation was miserable as there was no water and food and we remained in the jungle for one day and night in the cold weather," he said.

Rahmani further added that the smugglers did not start their journey during the day because the Turkish police were patrolling the area and they started their journey around 5:00 or 6:00 pm in the evening after they were put in a small rubber boat.

He said the boat was filled by 19 people including five children and there was no way to return because the smugglers were armed with pistols and were threatening us to get on to the boat.

In the initial 15 minutes of the journey the weather became stormy and the waves of the water pushed the boat forcing its more to shut down, Rahmani said, adding that the boat overturned as the storm and heavy rain continued and all on board the boat drowned in the river.

"My son was resting and all of a sudden started shouting as my wife my sitting away from me. I took immediately but the water waves dispersed us apart," Rahmani said while sobbing in sorrow. He said a 12 to 13-yearodl girl had also drowned in the water but ... (More on P4)... (12)

Pakistani General Discusses Afghan Issue with US Envoy

ISLAMABAD - The Pakistani Chief of Army Staff, General Raheel Sharif, on Monday received the US special representative for Afghanistan and Pakistan, Richard G. Olson and discussed the security situation in Afghanistan. According to a brief statement of the Army Inter-Services Public Relations, the meeting took place in Rawalpindi city. The Pentagon keeps about 10,000 soldiers in Afghanistan. Given the

violence that shakes the Central Asian nation, US President, Barack Obama, was forced in October to announce that the military troops will stay beyond the end of his term in January 2017. The meeting between Sharif and Olson is to be held just before a regional conference on Afghanistan and focused on the revival of the stalled peace process between the Kabul government and the Taliban.

965,000 Migrants Registered through November: Germany

BERLIN - The number of people registered as asylum-seekers in Germany this year hit 965,000 by the end of November, well above a forecast for the whole year that was made less than four months ago, the country's interior minister said Monday.

Some 206,000 new arrivals were registered in November. UAE Sets New Conditions for Afghans Applying for Visa

KABUL - The Afghan authorities have reached to a new agreement with the United Arab Emirates (UAE) officials regarding the visit of Afghan citizens holding newly issued electronic passports, it has

been reported. The reported agreement between the Afghan and UAE officials comes months after restrictions were imposed on Afghan citizens visiting UAE. Under the imposed restrictions, the Afghan citizens were obliged to verify their passports from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs before they could become eligible to obtain a UAE visa.

According to reports, UAE officials have agreed to grant visas for the Afghan citizens once the Central Passport Department inserts the 'Father Name' of the passport holder in the electronic passports,

even accepting the handwriting on the passports. Ahmad Shekib Mostaghni,

spokesman for the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MoFA), told BBC Farsi that the verification process of the passports through MoFA was relatively lengthy as it was sent to the UAE embassy through the Consulate of the ministry.

He said the ministry was forced to intervene and hold talks with the UAE officials to resolve the issue and it was revealed by UAE officials that the specifications of the Afghan citizens were recorded by their First Name and Father Name in their bank of information but the newly issued electronic passports does not mention the Father Name of the passport holder and has been replaced by Family name. Biden Makes Trip to Ukraine in Sign of **US Support**

KUNDUZ - The government forces have dismantled Taliban bastion and hideouts in Dasht-e-Archi district of the northern Kunduz province during mounting pressure and crackdown over the past one month, Kunduz-based Division commander General Mohiuding Ghori said Mon-

"The Taliban bastion, command and control system as well as their hideouts have been destroyed during constant military crackdown over the past one month," Ghori told reporters here.

Taliban militants captured Kunduz provincial capital the Kunduz city in early October. However, the security forces after launching counter-offensive recaptured the city in mid October and continued

crackdown against militants elsewhere in the province bordering Tajikistan. Dasht-e-Archi had served as

Taliban bastion in Kunduz from where the militants organized attacks against government interests in Kunduz and the neighboring Baghlan and Takhar provinces. Following recapturing Kun-

duz city in mid October the security forces began attacking militants elsewhere in Kunduz province including Dasht-e-Archi, Chardara and Imam Sahib districts forcing militants to retreat to the neighboring Takhar province. General Ghori, however, admitted that the Taliban militants have been conducting isolated attacks in Dasht-e-Archi district and other parts of ...(More on P4)...(13)
