25 Militants Killed in Helmand Clearing Operation

LASHKARGAH - At least 25 Taliban insurgents have been killed during security forces searching operations in four districts of southern Helmand province, an official said on Tuesday. Provincial police chief, Brig. Gen. Aqa Noor Kintouz, told a press conference on Tuesday that the operations were launched in Marja, Garam Sir, Nawa and Nadali districts of the province. He said that only Nawa district was

still with the Taliban but the centers and parts of other districts operated were with Afghan forces.

Kintoz said 25 militants were killed during an operation of Afghan ground and air forces in Bashran locality of



Lashkargah, the provincial capital on Monday night.

The militants supported by Pakistan intelligence agency planned to capture Lashkargah city, but the group failed to achieve such goals, he added.

"Taliban wanted to shift the Quetta Shura to Helmand province but the militants could not do so," he said, adding the Afghan forces were recently equipped with new American weapons to help them defeat militants in their operations.

2 Smugglers Held, 510kgs of Hashish Seized in Nangarhar

JALALABAD - Two drug traffickers have been detained and 510 kilograms of hashish seized during separate operations in eastern Nangarhar province, police said on Tuesday. Police spokesman Col. Hazrat Hussain Mashriqiwal told a press conference police personnel seized 510 kilograms of hashish concealed in a truck in the Shinwari Kala of Batikot district.

He said the drugs were to be smuggled to Ghanikhel district. The drug traffickers managed to escape, leaving behind the truck. Elsewhere, 27 packets of precious stones

were recovered and two men were detained in Behsud district, he added.

Meanwhile, an active Taliban member was arrested in Momand Dara district during a police patrol, Mashriqiwal said. (Pajhwok)

Two Women Killed in Herat



Officials at the Herat regional hospital said that the bodies of two women were brought to the hospital on Monday - both of whom had been shot.

The officials said the body of a 27-year-old women was found by police in Zubaida Garden area of PD5 in Herat city.

The second victim was a 60-year-old woman who was shot dead by her son in Kart-e-Shahr of Herat city.

Police have started investigations into both incidents, officials said. (Tolonews)

Border Police Commander Dead in Kunar Blast

ASADABAD - A commander of the border police and his bodyguard have been killed in a roadside explosion in eastern Kunar province, an official said on Tuesday.

Police Chief Maj. Gen. Jumah Gul Himmat told Pajhwok Afghan News the incident took place on Monday night at around 11:59pm in Dangam district.

He said Lt. Col. Wali Jan, commander of the border police 3rd battalion, was on his way to visit a check-post when a roadside explosion struck his vehicle. (Pajhwok)

Girl Killed, 2 Wounded as **Insurgents** Attack Bus



FAIZABAD - Local security officials on Tuesday said a 10 years old girl has been killed and two other people wounded during an insurgent attack in northeastern Badakhshan province.

Crime branch chief, Col. Sakhi Dad Haideri, told Pajhwok Afghan News a bus heading from Sheghnan district to Faizabad, the capital of Badakhshan, came under attack last night.

He said years old Sebrawas killed and her brother injured along with another passenger in the attack. The injured were evacuated to hospital, he said, adding police were investigating the incident. (Pajhwok)


