

Gunmen Kill Five Female Afghan Airport Staff in Kandahar

KANDAHAR - Five female Afghan guards working in the airport in southern Kandahar were killed by unknown gunmen as they were on their way to work, security officials said on Saturday, the latest in a string of attacks against women in Afghanistan. From bomb attacks to targeted or honor killings or domestic abuses, Afghan women have borne the brunt of the 15 years of conflicts during the Taliban-led insurgency as security has deteriorated and violence has increased in most parts of the country. Samim Khpulwak, spokesman for the governor of Kandahar, said the five women were in charge of searching female travelers at the Kandahar airport,



and had been hired by a private security company. "Two gunmen on motorbike followed their van and opened fire on them, killing the five and their driver this morning, said Samim. No group has claimed responsibility for Saturday's attack but the Taliban insurgents waging an insurgency to topple the foreign-backed government of President Ashraf Ghani oppose women working outside their homes. Although Afghan women had made hard-fought rights gains in education and work since the collapse of austere Taliban regime in 2001, there are growing fears that these could reverse with the deterioration of security and increase in violence. ...*(More on P4)...(15)*

Sharbat Gula Case: NADRA Officials Freed on Bail

PESHAWAR - Two former officials of the National Database and Registration Authority (NADRA), accused of issuing the Pakistani Computerised National Identity Card (CNIC) to National Geographic's famed 'Afghan Girl', Sharbat Gula, have been granted bail. Peshawar High Court judge Justice Yahya Afridi ordered the release of Emad Khan and Mohsin Ehsan on bail on Friday after hearing arguments from the defence counsel and the Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) lawyer. The pre-arrest bail of another ex-official of NADRA, Palwasha Afridi, has already been confirmed in the case. The petitioners' lawyer, Amir Javed, submitted his clients had played no role in verification of the documents that led to issuance of the CNIC to Sharbat Gula. Despite aversion from the FIA lawyer, the judge granted the petitioners. Imam Detained Over Marrying 2 Sisters off to a Man

JALALABAD - A tribal elder and prayer leader, who conducted marriage between two sisters and a man, has been arrested in Khewa district of eastern Nangarhar province, an official said on Saturday. Attaullah Khogyani, the governor's spokesman, told a press conference here that the girls and their family had accused 15 individuals of being involved in the forbidden act. The girl nicknamed Saima had told reporters at the Nangarhar Women's Affairs department on November 20 that her husband on the very first night of their marriage accused her of losing her virginity before the wedlock and the same night married her younger sister. Khogyani said the provincial administration was serious in investigating the matter and finding main reason behind the issue. All the perpetrators involved would be arrested soon. According to Khogyani, the Imam marrying the two sisters to one man, named Malak Ikram, also a tribal elder, was involved and had been recently detained by security forces. He assured the provincial administration would give the victim girls their rights and allow no one to violate their rights. 3 Killed in Gun Attack on NDS Building in Paghman

KABUL CITY - Three people, including an intelligence official and a woman, were killed and another two persons injured in a gun attack in Paghman district of central Kabul province on Saturday, an official said. Paghman district's police chief, Col. Amrullah, told Pajhwok Afghan News two gunmen opened fire at the National Directorate of Security or NDS compound in the district's bazaar at around 11am today. He said the dead included an NDS official and a woman, and the injured included a policeman and a woman who had been evacuated to hospital and their condition was said to be stable. He said the attackers had escaped and no group had taken responsibility for the gun attack. (Pajhwok)

Drone Attack Kills 16 IS Fighters

JALALABAD - A total of 16 militants affiliated with Islamic State (IS) group were killed after an unmanned plane targeted their hideouts in Achin district of the eastern Nangarhar province on Friday, provincial police chief Hazrat Hussain Mashriqwal said Saturday. The air raids, according to the official, were conducted in Abdulkhil village of Achin district Friday night during which a huge weapon cache of IS militants was also destroyed. Militants' loyal to IS are yet to make comments on the situation. Nangarhar province with



Jalalabad city as its capital, 120 km east of Kabul, has been the scene of IS outfit's violent incidents over the past nearly one year. Scores of IS fighters have reportedly been killed by airstrikes in the eastern Nangarhar province over the past couple of months. (Xinhua)

Afghan Forces Kill 19 Militants in Paktia

GARDEZ - Security forces have killed 19 militants over the past seven days in Zarmat district of the eastern Paktia province, district governor Kaptan Ekhlis said Saturday. "The operations were launched in Zarmat district one week ago and concluded last night; 19 rebels were killed and two others injured in the operations," Ekhlis told Xinhua. "The armed militants have fled the area and law and order have been retorted to

Girls' School Torched in Logar

PUL-I-ALAM - A girl's school has been torched by unknown people in the Mohammad Agha district of central Logar province, local officials said on Saturday. 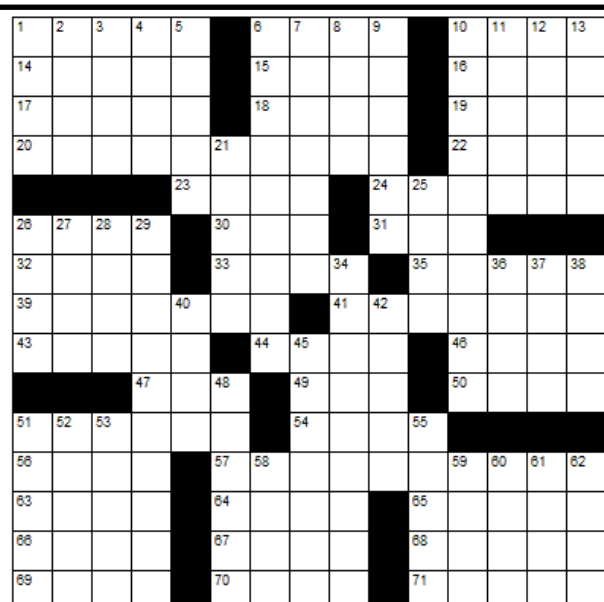
