State Land in Nangarhar to be Retaken

3,000 acres of land close to the irrigation department in Jalalabad, the capital of eastern Nangarhar province, is occupied by grabbers, officials said on Tues-

Senior officials and other influential elements have been involved in occupying the state land. Eng. Ziarat Gul Rahil, director of irrigation, ac-



knowledged thousands of acres of government property had been occupied.But the authorities have been unable to vacate the land. "We have made repeated attempts to evict the grabbers but could not succeed," he said.

He asked the central government to direct the authorities concerned to help retake the land. Calling the occupation of state land a major issue, provincial council members also demanded the government adopt a strict policy against usurpers.

Dr. Nasir Kamawal, deputy head of the provincial council, regretted government-owned land was being occupied on a daily basis. An effective plan was needed to prosecute the perpetrators, he believed. (Pajhwok)

3 Injured in **Kunduz Explosion**

KUNDUZ CITY - Three civilians, including a child, were wounded when a magnetic bomb went off in northern Kunduz province on Tuesday northern.

The device was attached to a vehicle of the Afghan National Army (ANA, police spokesman Syed Sarwar Hussaini told Pajhwok Afghan News. He said the explosion took

place around 2:30pm in front of Arz Begi mosque in the provincial capital, wounding two passersby. But Naqibullah, giving a witness account, said an 11 year old child and two men were wounded in the blast.

On Monday, a civilian was killed and six others, including three policemen, were wounded in a similar incident.

More than 10 magnetic bomb attacks targeting police and ANA vehicles in Kunduz have taken place during the last few months. (Pajhwok)

Women to Benefit from **Agriculture Programme**



MAIMANA - With the distribution of refined seeds and special tents for cultivating vegetables in the winter season, up to 3,000 women in northern Faryab province would benefit from the programme, officials

Director of Agriculture Asadullah Bahar told Pajhwok Afghan News the department distributed refined seeds of different vegetables along with plastic and grill among 50 women to establish tent farms.

Bahar expressed satisfaction over the programme and said they had employed some women which would help resolve problems of some farmers.

Nilofar Anayat, head of the gardening program, said that refined seeds and tents were distributed after they surveyed districts of Khwaja Sabzposh, Pashtunkot and Maimana City.

She added that carrot, radish, pepper, caulito, eggplant, turnip, and other vegetables would be cultivated.

Nilofar expressed optimism that 3,000 women would benefit from these farms and would receive more agro related aid in the next step.

Fauzia, a resident of Maimana City, said that in the last seven months she could sell vegetables to her neighbors and in the market. They could also use the byproducts like tomato sauce and sell it in the market, she added

She said they were eleven members in her family and after the programme her financial situation had improved manifold. Out of the 67 women who get training, at least 15 of them would be selected to attend seminars and then lead the farms. These ... (More on P4)... (14)

7 Militants Killed in **Separate Military Raids**

KABUL - At least seven insurgents were killed including two foreign nationals in separate military operations during the past 24 hours, the Ministry of Defense (MoD) said in a statement on Tuesday.

ZARANJ - The revenue of western Nimroz province has significantly increased, but officials on Monday complained the Iranian government had banned the entry of some transit trucks coming to the port.

Customs Director Wais Sultani told Pajhwok Afghan News his department was established two years ago with little facilities but efforts were being made to upgrade it to modern standards.

He said eight warehouses were built on 18 acres of land and 29,000 square metres land was concreted by the World Bank (WB) at a cost of \$2 millions. The merchandise, he said, was not kept in the open.






