Obama Warns Afghanistan Remains Dangerous

WASHINGTON - US president Barack Obama on Sunday declared the war against terrorism in Afghanistan had now come to a responsible conclusion, but warned the country remained a dangerous place.

"Afghanistan remains a dangerous place and the Afghan people and their security forces continue to make tremendous sacrifices in defence of their country," Obama said in a statement after a formal ceremony in Kabul ended the US and NATO combat mission.

Obama said the US would maintain a limited military presence in Afghanistan to train, advise and assist Afghan forces and to conduct counterterrorism operations



against the remnants of Al Qaeda at the invitation of the Afghan government.

He said the US personnel would continue to face risks, reflecting the enduring commitment of the United States to the Afghan people.

From January 1, the Operation Enduring Freedom would be replaced by Operation Freedom's Sentinel, to help secure and build upon the gains of the last 13 years. "Thanks to the extraordinary sacrifices of our men and women in uniform, our combat mission in Afghanistan is

MOSCOW - Russia has no plan to send troops to Afghanistan after the NATO-led International Security Assistance Force (ISAF) ended its combat mission there, a senior diplomat said Monday. On Sunday, the ISAF formally ended its 13-yearold combat mission in Afghanistan. Some 13,000 troops, including 10,800 Americans, will stay in Afghanistan in 2015 to

Amendments to Population **Registration Act Drafted**

KABUL - The Wolesi Jirga's interior security commission would present before the lower house a set of amendments to some articles of the controversial Population Registration Act on Wednesday.

After being approved by the assembly, the Population Registration Bill was signed into law by President Ashraf Ghani amid objections by some lawmakers, civil society groups and political parties over not mentioning word "Afghan" in the Computerized National Identity Cards (CNICs).

As the protests continued, the president referred the issue to the Supreme Court, but the apex court is yet to deliver a ruling in this regard.

80 Militants Give up Fighting

KABUL - An 80-member Taliban group gave up fighting in Afghanistan while a Taliban-organized roadside bomb blast killed two Afghan police personnel and injured two others on Monday, officials confirmed.

According to police, more than seven dozen militants, laid down their arms in the northern Jauzjan province, while two police personnel lost their lives in a roadside bomb in the southwest Nimroz province. "A total of 80 militants under Mufti Nematullah who were involved in anti-government activities in Qushtapa and Darzab districts of Jawzjan province over the past couple of years laid down arms and gave up fighting Monday," provincial police chief Faqir Mohammad Jawzjani told Xinhua.

Giving up fighting by these people could be a major blow to the anti-government militants in Jawzjan and adjoining provinces, the police chief added.

200 Taliban Militants Surrender to Gen. Dostum

SHEBIRGHAN - Around 200 Taliban militants renounced violence and surrendered to first Vice-President Gen. Abdul Rashid Dostum in northern Jawzjan province on Monday.

The militants laid down their weapons and announced their support from the Government of National Unity in Darzab district, during Gen. Dostum's visit.

Gen. Dostum is visiting the northern Jawzjan province after he was instructed by President Mohammad Ashraf Ghani, according to an online statement from Gen. Dos-He welcomed the surrender of Tali-

ban militants and said the move by Taliban militants in Jawzjan is a step that would lead to a nationwide peace and stability.

Gen. Dostum called on other militants to join peace process, similarly as the militants have surrendered in Jawzjan province.

He also pledged to provide employment opportunities for all the militants who laid their weapons and joined peace process.

Jawzjan is among the relatively volatile provinces in northern Afghanistan where anti-government armed militant groups are actively operating ... (More on P4)...(7)
