

60 Taliban Killed in Sangin Airstrike: Governor

LASHKARGAH - The governor, while not denying civilian casualties in an airstrike in Sangin district of southern Helmand province, on Saturday said the foreign troops targeted Taliban's hideouts.

Governor Hayatullah Hayat told a joint news conference with military officials here that no civilian lived the incident site, three kilometers from the Sangin district centre. He said only Taliban insurgents' hideouts existed in the targeted area.

Hayat said insurgents from various districts and provinces were assembling in Sangin to devise a plan for capturing



the district. He, however, said at least 60 insurgents were killed on Thursday night in security operations backed foreign air forces.

"There are allegations of civilian casualties in airstrikes in Mata Lakra and Chinari areas; we don't reject because insurgents might have willfully brought civilians to the area for defaming the government."

According to him, investigation is ongoing to find accurate information about the allegations echoed by Taliban and some government officials.

Badakhshan: 2 Shot Dead, 4 Injured in Avalanche

FAIZABAD - Two men, including a police officer, have been shot dead by unknown gunmen in northeastern Badakhshan province, an official said on Saturday. Col. Sakhi-dad Haidari, crime branch chief, told Pajhwok Aghan News the incident occurred in the 1st municipality district of Faizabad, the provincial capital, at around 8pm on Friday night. He said the unidentified gunmen opened fire at Ahmad Shah, a resident of the area, and Adil, a counter-terrorism officer, and killed both. ... (More on P4)...(15)

Suicide Bomber Targets Afghan Military Convoy

KABUL - A suicide car bombing Saturday killed at least seven people and wounded many others in Afghanistan's embattled southern province of Helmand, officials said.

Afghan television stations reported the blast left at least 12 dead.

The Taliban insurgency took responsibility for the bombing, according to a spokesman for the group, who claimed army officers and soldiers were among the casualties.

The attack near a bank in the provincial capital of Lashkar Gah was aimed at an Afghan



National Army (ANA) convoy, a provincial government spokesman told VOA. Soldiers and civilians were among those killed and wounded, said Omar Zwak. He added that at least 21 wounded people have been sent to area hospitals. The victims were collecting their salaries when the ... (More on P4)...(17)

Taliban Claim Responsibility for Deadly Afghan Blast

KABUL - The Taliban have claimed responsibility for a car bomb blast Saturday that killed at least eight people in southern Afghanistan.

In a text message to journalists, Taliban spokesman Qari Yousuf Ahmadi said the group was behind the early-morning attack. The explosion happened in Lashkar Gah, capital of Helmand province.

A least 19 other people were wounded in the explosion, according to Omar Zwak, a spokesman for the province. (BBC)

12 Militiamen Defect to Taliban in Sar-I-Pul

SAR-I-PUL CITY - A dozen public uprising members, along with their weapons, led by Khair Mohammad have joined the Taliban ranks in the capital of northern Sar-i-Pul province, an official said on Saturday.

Governor Mohammad Zahir Wahdat said the 12 individuals surrendered to the Taliban in Gala Jar area of Sar-i-Pul city, the provincial capital, and turned in their 12 guns.

Similarly, about two weeks back, a 21-member group



of uprising forces joined the Taliban ranks in Siyad district of the province. (Pajhwok)

Kandahar-Uruzgan Highway Motorists Forced to Use Alternate Routes

KABUL - Motorists travelling between Kandahar and Uruzgan have raised concerns over the lack of safe routes between the two provinces after the Taliban closed the key highway months ago.

According to motorists, they are now using alternate routes which are unpaved and not safe.

They said the Kandahar-Uruzgan highway has been closed for about five months.

"People were stuck here for days because of rain and snowfall. The road is not paved and its security is not maintained. We



face lots of difficulties here," said Azizullah, an Uruzgan resident. Kandahar local officials meanwhile said they will address these problems as soon as possible.

Abdul Hanan Munib, Kandahar's acting governor, said that plans are being drawn up to build a 40km stretch of road as an alternate route. The ... (More on P4)...(18)
