## 20 Police Personnel Dead in Logar Attack

## Govt. Spokesmen Lack Coordination

KABUL - The Chief Executive Officer (CEO)'s office on Tuesday said the unity government should adopt a single terminology for terrorists so that government spokespersons could clearly communicate with the people and the media. CEO's spokesman Mujib Rahman Rahimi, addressing a meeting of senior government's



spokesmen in Kabul, said since the unity government was newly-formed; it was yet to frame matching policies on the peace process, terrorism, foreign affairs and reforms. ## Tajikistan Supplies Extra 25mn Kwh of Electricity this Year to Afghanistan



KABUL - Neighboring country Tajikistan supplied an extra 25mn kWh of electricity to Afghanistan in January 2015. Sangtuda-1 and Sangtuda-2 power networks transmitted nearly 55mn kWh of electricity to Afghanistan, 25mn kWh more than they did last year in the same period.

In 2014, Tajikistan exported 1.1 billion kWh of electricity to neighboring Afghanistan. Tajikistan's electricity to Afghanistan is exported through the 22kW and 110 kW networks from Santuda-1 and Sangtuda-2 hydroelectric power plants. Meanwhile, Germany and Norway ... (More on P4)...(11)
