

# Taliban Factions Clash Leave 10 Dead

FARAH CITY - At least ten Taliban insurgents were killed in the latest infighting among the Taliban factions in western Farah province.

According to the local officials, the latest infighting was ignited following a roadside bomb explosion that left several militants dead.

The officials further added that the incident took place in Bakwa district after a landmine planted by Taliban group targeted the



other rival group as they were on their way from Helmand to Farah. District administrative chief Ghawsuddin confirmed the incident and said the latest infighting took place between the supporters of Mullah Rasool and Mullah Haibatullah Akhوندزاد.

He said it is yet not clear the supporters of which group was targeted in the blast but confirmed that both the explosion and infighting left at least 10 Taliban insurgents dead. ...*(More on P4)...(16)*

## 4 Insurgents Killed, Would-be Suicide Bomber Arrested

KABUL - Four Taliban militants, including two notorious commanders of the Haqqani network, have been killed in and a would-be suicide bomber detained, the government said on Sunday.

A statement from the Ministry of Interior (Mol) said special police forces conducted an operation in the Lalpura district of Nangarhar province, killing four insurgents including two Haqqani-network commanders Imran Khan and Shahin.

It added the two others Haqqani network members named Ziaurahman and Sarbilan were arrested and four weapons and a rocket seized during the overnight operation.

Separately, a would-be suicide bomber was arrested by the National directorate of security (NDS) personnel in the Orgun district of Paktika province on Saturday. The spy service said the ...*(More on P4)...(17)*

## 6 Insurgents Killed, 4 Wounded in Farah Roadside Bombing

FARAH CITY - Six Taliban militants have been killed and four others wounded in a roadside bombing in the Bakwa district of western Farah province, police said on Sunday.

The provincial police spokesman, Iqbal Bahir, told Pajhwok Afghan News the predawn explosion took place in the Porza area of the district at around 4am.

According to him, the bomb ripped through a Land Cruiser carrying the rebels from Gulistan district to Bakwa, killing six of them and wounding four others. He claimed the militants



themselves had placed the bomb. The Taliban have so far said nothing about the explosion and casualties. The group claimed there was no dispute among Taliban in Bakwa district. *(Pajhwok)*

## Newly-Wed Couple Dies of Suffocation: Jawzjan

SHIBERGHAN - A newly-wed couple died of suffocation on the first night of their wedding in the capital of northern Jawzjan province, an official said Sunday. Crime department head Abdul Malik Mam-

nun told Pajhwok Afghan News the wedding to place in the capital of Balkh province, Mazar-i-Sharif, on Saturday. "They arrived in Shiberghan yesterday. The couple lighted a gas-run heater in their room and

went to sleep leaving the heater on. They were found dead in the morning," he said. He said ignoring gas heaters often resulted in such sad incidents. The incident in Shiberghan was the first

of its kind. The groom, Mohammad Yunus, was a third year law student at Kabul University. Dr. Mohammad Haroon Arif, provincial hospital chief, said the couple died of lack of oxygen. *(Pajhwok)*

## SOS from A Widow Living in Patched Tent with 8 Children

KHOST CITY - A widow from southern Khost province, living in a patched tent with her eight children, has sought assistance from the government and humanitarian

Sherin Gula is living along with her children in Azadi Mena area, on the outskirts of Khost City, in miserable conditions. She has a tattered blanket to wrap her children in.

With no firewood to heat up her tent, Gula said her children stepped out of the makeshift abode early in the morning to bask in the sun.



"I cover them all with the single blanket we have." She collects paper pieces that are burnt inside the tent. Her son-in-law is also living with his children in another dark corner in similar plight. The compound owner dies not take rent from them. Gula's husband and elder son died years ago. Now she is living with her four daughters and as ...*(More on P4)...(18)*


