

Taliban Widely Active where Baghlan Coalminers were Shot

KABUL - Video footage obtained by TOLONews shows that Taliban militants are extremely active in the Tala Wa Barfak district in Baghlan where at least eight coalminers were killed earlier this month. The video shows how security forces returned to Baghlan's capital city, Pule-Khumri, after reportedly failing to arrest the perpetrators of the attack on coalminers due to the presence and activity of the Taliban in the district. TOLONews' Hamid Shirzai, who visited the area where the coalminers were shot, said signs of the shooting were



still visible in the area. Shirzai, who also accompanied a military convoy into the district, said as the security forces moved into the area, they could see Taliban strongholds getting stronger near the mountainous areas in Tala Wa Barfak. "We are in Anar Dara area. We conducted the operation as per the order of President [Ashraf Ghani]. We are here to arrest the two men who allergy gunned down the coalminers. We arrived here but the two suspects are fugitives," said Lieutenant Colonel Ziauddin, commander of first Battalion of 209 Shahin Corps. ...*(More on P4)...(20)*

Taliban Suffer Heavy Casualties as 2 Major IED Factories Destroyed

KABUL - The Taliban militants suffered heavy casualties during an operation of the Afghan security forces in western Nimroz province of Afghanistan, the Ministry of Interior (MoI) said Thursday. According to a statement by MoI, at least 80 Taliban insurgents were killed and two large Improvised Explosive Device (IED) factories were destroyed during the operation. The statement further added that the militants suffered casualties during the operations which were launched ten days ago in Khashrud district. According to MoI, a compound used by the shadow district governor of the Taliban was also destroyed during the operations and at least 20 foreign insurgents were killed. Maternal, Child Mortality Increases in Baghlan District

PULKHUMRI - Residents of Tala Wa Barfak district in Baghlan said they are concerned about an increase in maternal and child mortality in their region due to a lack of access to Pule-Khumri, the capital city of the province.



The residents said it takes 10 hours to travel to the city from the district; therefore, a number of pregnant women and their children die on the way to hospital. The residents claimed that more than five women and

children lose their lives every month on the way to hospitals in the central city of the province. "At least five to six pregnant women or their children lose their lives on the way to the hospital due to unconstructed roads," said Fazl Ahmad, a resident of Tala Wa Barfak. 6 Dead, 4 Al-Qaeda Members Held in Nangarhar Raid

JALALABAD - Six people have killed, two wounded and four Al-Qaeda members, including the group's financial affairs in charge, arrested in security forces raid in the GhaniKhel district of eastern Nangarhar province, an official said on Friday. Two night vision binoculars, signal detectors, one Kalashnikov and some other equipment were recovered from the detainees in the overnight raid conducted in the Shpagwistama Wyali locality, Attaullah Khogyani, the governor's spokesman said. He did not provide the identity of dead and wounded individuals, but said a del-



egation had been dispatched to the area for investigations. Abdul Khaliq Nazari, the town's administrative chief, confirmed the incident but could not be reached for further details. Atal Shinwari, the resident of locality, also confirmed the late night operation in the area and said six people were killed in security forces raid. He said two guests and four innocent young men had been killed during the offensive. *(Pajhwok)*

21 Rebels Killed, Wounded in Kapisa Offensive

MAHMOOD RAQI - Twenty-one militants have been killed and wounded and militants have been purged of four localities in the Tagab district of central northeastern Kapisa province during ongoing clearing operation, an official said on Friday.



Police Chief Brig. Gen. Mohammad Razaq Yaqubi told Pajhwok Afghan News fighting was still ongoing in some areas of the district between security forces and the militants.

He said four large areas had been cleared of the insurgents and as many rebel commanders were among 21 killed and wounded. He said the operation would continue until militants were purged of all southern areas of the district. Haji Jannat, the resident of locality, said fighting was underway in the southern and central part of the district in which local security forces, civilians and militants suffered casualties. 12 Militants Killed in Garamser District

LASHKARGAH - Local officials on Thursday said 12 militants including a commander have been killed in an airstrike in Garamser district of southern Helmand province. The district chief, Ayub Omar Omari, told Pajhwok Afghan News that Afghan forces conducted the air raids in Gimak and Kharki areas of the district on Wednesday night. He said 12 militants were killed, including Mualvi At-tiqullah, a notorious Taliban commander, and several others were wounded. The governor's spokesman, Omar Zwak, confirmed the



Taliban's casualties in Garamser and said security situation in the district was improving and the rebels were on the run. However, there has been no word from the Taliban about the air strikes. Six of 14 districts of Helmand, the opium rich region, are completely under Taliban control. The Afghan forces control only centers of a number of other districts. *(Pajhwok)*


