## Xi Arrives in Saudi Arabia, Starts 3-Nation **Mideast Visit**

RIYADH - Chinese Presi- at the airport. "Since dent Xi Jinping arrived in China and Saudi Arabia Saudi Arabia Tuesday on the first stop of his threenation tour of the Middle East, as the world's second-largest economy seeks closer political and economic ties with the region.

This is the first state visit by a Chinese head of state to Saudi Arabia in seven years. Xi will also travel to Egypt and Iran on his first overseas visit this year that lasts from Jan. 19 to 23.

Saudi Arabia sent four fighter jets to escort Xi's plane when it entered the country's airspace. The president was received by Deputy Crown Prince Mohammed bin Salman forged diplomatic ties 26 years ago, our relationship has developed by leaps and bounds, with mutual political trust deepening continuously and rich results in cooperation in various fields,' Xi said in written remarks upon arrival.

During his two-day stay in Riyadh, Xi is scheduled to hold summit talks with King Salman bin Abdulaziz Al Saud to discuss lifting bilateral ties to a comprehensive strategic partnership.

#### Tajikistan Recognizedas most **Starving Country in Central Asia:Global Hunger Index**

BISHKEK - Tajikistan was undernourished, was recognized as the most starving country in Central Asia with 30% of the level of food shortage, according to the Global Hunger Index 2015 prepared by the experts of the International Food Policy Research Institute.

The Index was made on the basis of the study of such features as the percentage of population that is undernourished, the level of underdevelopment of children under 5 years and the percentage of children, who die before the age

of five. So, according to the document, 33.2% of the opulation of Tajikistan

26.8% and the mortality rate of children under 5 years was 4.8% in 2015. Kazakhstan was a leader among the Central Asian countries with 8% of the level of hunger. Second place was gained by Kyrgyzstan with 9.4%, then Turk-12.9% menistan – Uzbekistan - 13.3% and Tajikistan with a serious level of hunger among the population -30.3%. The most starving coun-

GENEVA - Thousands of refugee children traveling along the migration route through Turkey and southeastern Europe are at risk from a sustained spell of freezing weather in the next two weeks, the United Nations and aid agencies said on Tuesday. The U.N. weather agency said it forecast belowtemperatures and heavy snowfall in the next two weeks in the eastern Balkan peninsula, Turkey, the eastern Mediterranean and Syria, Lebanon, Israel and Jordan. TOKYO - Japan's foreign minister pledged Tuesday to continue talks with Russia even though the two countries still lack a World War II peace treaty, saying Moscow is key to resolving international threats from Syria and North Korea.

Fumio Kishida also announced \$350 million in new aid to help stabilize Syria and its neighboring countries amid the region's massive refugee crisis, following \$810 million in earlier humanitarian support. Kishida said in a speech in Tokyo that a diplomatic dialogue between Japan and Russia is indispensable, even though a territorial dispute has prevented them from technically ending their World War II hostilities. He said the two sides are seeking to hold summit talks "at the most appropriate time" this year.

NEW DELHI - Indian not to give account of

GENEVA - The number of civilians killed in violence in Iraq over the past two years is "staggering", the United Nations said Tuesday, with a death toll of at least 18,802 people and another 36,245 injured. Those figures, which are likely an underestimate, count casualties incurred from January 1, 2014 through October 31, 2015, according to a report by the UN Assistance Mission for Iraq (UNAMI) and the UN human rights agency. "Even the obscene casualty figures fail to accurately reflect exactly how terribly civilians are suffering in Iraq," UN rights chief ZeidRa'ad Al Hussein warned in a statement. "The figures capture those who were killed or maimed by overt violence, but countless others have died from the lack of access to basic food, water or medical care," he pointed out. The UN said around 3.2 million people have been internally displaced in Iraq since the beginning of 2014 when the Islamic State (IS) group took over large parts of the country.(AFP)
