# **U.S. Announces Additional**



WASHINGTON - The Pentagon announced on Monday it would deploy an additional 560 troops to Iraq to fight the extremist group the Islamic State (IS).

"The additional troops will provide a range of support for Iraqi Security Forces, including infrastructure and logistical capabilities at the airfield near Qayyarah," said a Pentagon statement, adding that announcement was made by U.S. Secretary of Defense Ash Carter during his visit to Iraq.

"As the campaign shifts toward Mosul, more than 250 miles from the Iraqi capital, the airfield will become a vital springboard for the ISF offensive into Mosul," said the statement.

The latest increase of U.S. troops in Iraq brings the total U.S. troops there to 4,647. (Xinhua)



## **UNHCR Calls for Open Borders for Possible South Sudan Refugee Outflows**

KAMPALA - The United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UN-HCR) on Tuesday appealed to armed parties in South Sudan to ensure safe passage for people fleeing the fighting that erupted late last week in the capital, Juba.

The UN refugee agency in a statement called on the rival troops loyal to President Salva Kiir and First Vice-President Riek Machar to keep borders open to people fleeing and seeking asylum in the neighboring countries.

"UNHCR is calling on all armed parties to ensure safe passage for people

fleeing the fighting that erupted late last week in Juba and we urge neighboring countries to keep borders open to people seeking asylum," said the statement.

ROME - At least 20 people were killed and dozens injured as two trains collided and clashed head-on in southern Italy on Tuesday, local media reported.

According to the latest reports of ANSA news agency and Rai state television, the collision happened on a single-track railway around 11:30 a.m. local time in the southern Puglia region.

After the incident, rescue operation was in full swing. Police, emergency personnel and ambulances rushed to the crash site, located in a countryside area between the towns of Ruvo di Puglia and

BEIRUT - Visiting French Foreign Minister Jean-Marc Ayrault urged Tuesday all Lebanese parties to engage in dialogue to "find a solution" to the political stalemate the country has been going through.

He made the remarks following his meeting with Lebanon's Prime Minister Tammam Salam on the second day of his official visit to the country. "This is a call for everyone to shoulder their responsibilities in order to find a solution through dialogue," he added.

The French minister had voiced the same call on Monday evening during a dinner banquet in honor of the presidential candidates and

heads of the political parties. Lebanon has been without a president since May 25th, 2014 when the tenure of former President Michel Suleiman ended and the parliament failed to elect an incumbent due to the sharp political division among the Iranian and Syrian backed March 8 camp and the Saudi and western backed March 14 camp. After talks with Salam, Ayrault said he will soon resume his international contacts "so that we cooperate for the sake of finding a solution for Lebanon." ## **Infectious Diseases Kill** 1,564 in China in June

BEIJING - A total of 1,564 people died of infectious diseases on the Chinese mainland in June, the National Health and Family Planning Commission (NHFPC) said Tuesday.

A total of 869,281 cases were reported last month, according to the commis-

Among them, one case of cholera and one case of plague were reported, with no death. Plague and cholera are categorized as Class A infectious dis-

eases, the most serious category.

A total of 300,051 cases of Class B infectious diseases resulted in 1,518 deaths. Hepatitis, tuberculosis, syphilis, dysentery and gonorrhoea accounted for 91 percent of the cases in this category, according to the NHFPC. It added that Class C infectious diseases claimed 46 lives in June, with foot-and-mouth disease, infectious diarrhea and mumps reported most frequently. (Xinhua)
