# Deadly Week in Mediterranean As Smugglers Pack Boats before Ramadan: UNHCR

GENEVA - At least 880 migrants and refugees died trying to cross the Mediterranean last week, the U.N. refugee agency said on Tuesday, amid speculation that people smugglers may be trying to maximize their income before Ramadan begins.

This year is proving to be particularly deadly, with 2,510 lives lost in shipwrecks and capsizes, compared with 1,855 in the same period in 2015, UNHCR spokesman William Spindler said.

Nearly 204,000 people have made the perilous crossing to reach Europe so far this year, the U.N.

## Iran to Award **Power Plant** Deal to Turkey

TEHRAN - Turkey's media reported on Tuesday that Iran is preparing to award a major deal to Turkish private companies over building a power plant in the Islamic Republic.

Hurriyet newspaper reported that the value of the deal is estimated to be around \$3 billion, adding that the production capacity of the planned power plant will be 5,000 megawatts.

It quoted Iran's Deputy Energy Minister Hushang Falahatiyan as saying the Turkish energy sector had shown strong interest in Iran after the lifting of sanctions this past January.

"In the coming days, we will sign an investment deal with Turkish private sector companies for the construction of a 5,000 megawatt power plant in Iran. The size of this deal is \$3 billion," he has been quoted as saying in Hurriyet's report that was also carried by Reuters.

"We have other agreements with Turks but they have not been finalized and talks are continuing." The official further invited Turkish companies to invest in gasfired power projects as well as wind power projects in Iran. He also noted that power trade

between Iran and Turkey would increase, adding that Iran now sells around 350 megawatts of electricity to Turkey.

## | Libyan Forces should Fight IS, Not Each **Other: UN Envoy**

PARIS - The U.N. envoy for Libya on Tuesday urged rival factions there to unite against the Islamic State group and stop fighting each other. Martin Kobler held diplomatic meetings in Paris on reinforcing the fledgling U.N.-backed government as various Libyan forces are advancing on Islamic State strongholds.

He called for a joint army - "a sound effective structure for the fight against Daesh. Libyans should not fight amongst each other. They should fight united against the terrorism in this country." Daesh is the Arabic acronym for the IS group. Different militias loyal to the U.N.-backed government, as well as military forces allied with authorities based in the east, are making unilateral moves against the central city of Sirte, the main IS bastion in Libya. IS has exploited the turmoil gripping Libya since the 2011 uprising that ended

#### Heavy Clashes As Iraqi Forces Push into IS-Held Fallujah

CAMP TARIQ - Iraqi forces battling their way into Fallujah repelled a four-hour counterattack by the Islamic State group on Tuesday, a day after entering the southern part of the militant-held city with the help of U.S.-led airstrikes.

A leading aid group meanwhile raised alarm over the unfolding "human catastrophe" in Fallujah, where an estimated 50,000 people remain trapped, and renewed calls on warring parties to open up safe corridors for civilians to flee.

The dawn attack unfolded in Fallujah's Nuaimiya area, most of which was captured by Iraqi troops the previous day, two special forces officers told The Associated Press. They spoke anonymously because they were not authorized to release the information. IS militants used tunnels and snipers, and targeted Iraqi forces with six explosivesladen ... (More on P4)... (27)

# **UN Worried for Syrians Stranded** By Islamic State Advance

BEIRUT - The United Nations said on Tuesday it was worried about 8,000 Syrians trapped by fighting north of Aleppo where Islamic State has advanced against rebels, and that both Kurdish and rebel authorities had hindered people fleeing the area.

The fighting has displaced thousands more Syrians near the Turkish frontier where more than 160,000 people are already sheltering, most

of whom fled fighting earlier this year, the U.N. says.

"An unknown number of people are also unable to flee due to fighting and the closure of the main road leading north towards the town of Azaz in northwestern Syria," said a joint statement from the Resident and Humanitarian Coordinator for Syria and the Humanitarian Coordinator for the Syria Crisis.
