and international levels for peace with the Taliban, and galvanize it into a single 'Afghan-led and Afghan-own' process for peaceful resolution of the conflict.

The conference has become even more significant following the massive truck bombing that claimed up to 90 lives a few meters away from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, where the conference on June 6 would be held.

Dawa Khan Menapal, deputy spokesman for the president, told Anadolu Agency one of the objectives of the truck bombing was to disrupt this conference.

"A way for peaceful resolution of the conflict would be sought at this conference, talks and discussions with representatives of various countries would take place for an 'Afghan-led and Afghan-own' peace process", he said.

In the meeting with the ambassadors, Ghani presented the peace deal with Hezb-e-Islami as a success story of the Afghan-led peace initiative.

"Afghanistan has a strategic location that links South Asia with Central Asia and Europe. The terrorists want to insecure Afghanistan to eventually destabilize the region and the world", Ghani told the meeting. (AA)

Conveying his deepest condolences to the families and friends of those killed and injured in the murderous attack that took place this morning near the diplomatic zone in Kabul, Trump also commended the Afghan security forces for their steadfast efforts to defend the Afghan people from enemies who would seek to deny them the security and prosperity they so richly deserve, the White House said.

The US Secretary of State Rex Tillerson offered his deepest condolences to the families and friends of those who were killed and injured, including Afghan partners, members of the diplomatic and international communities, and many innocent Afghan citizens.

"We pray for a speedy recovery to the American and Afghan members of our mission staff and others who were injured in this attack, and we praise the Afghan Security Forces, police, and medical professionals who were the first responders to the scene," he said.

"In the face of this senseless and cowardly act, the U.S. commitment to Afghanistan is unwavering; the United States stands with the government and the people of Afghanistan and will continue to support their efforts to achieve peace, security, and prosperity for their country," Tillerson said.

The UN Secretary General António Guterres strongly condemns the terrorist attack in the city's diplomatic district in Afghanistan's capital, Kabul. In a statement he expressed his abhorrence at this act and underlined the need to reinforce the fight against terrorism and violent extremism.

"Indiscriminate attacks against civilians are grave violations of human rights and international humanitarian law and can never be justified. Those responsible for today's attack must be brought to justice," said a statement issues by his spokesman.

Condemning in strongest term the "heinous and cowardly terrorist attack" that took place during the Muslim holy month of Ramadan in the Wazir Akbar Khan area in Kabul on 31 May 2017, the UN Security Council

in a statement underlined the need to bring perpetrators, organizers, financiers and sponsors of these reprehensible acts of terrorism to justice.

Members of the Security Council stressed that those responsible for these killings should be held accountable, and urged all States, in accordance with their obligations under international law and relevant Security Council resolutions, to cooperate actively with the Government of Afghanistan and all other relevant authorities in this regard.

Canadian Foreign Minister Chrystia Freeland, said the timing of this cowardly attack during the holy month of Ramadan was deliberate and intended to target civilians and foreign service workers from some of the closest allies. (Pajhwok)

At least seven people were killed and 10 others wounded on Friday when a massive protest erupted at the site of a devastating suicide bombing in Kabul earlier in the week.

Ghani said security forces were duty-bound to deal patiently and professionally with demonstrators. "But protest organisors should not allow the misuse of this democratic right of the people..."

However, the government promised it would not let anyone incite violence, disturb the public order or whip up public sentiments in their petty personal interest. (Pajhwok)

Circle, which was the scene of Wednesday's deadly bombing, police started firing off tear gas canisters. Fire trucks also sprayed the demonstrators with water.

When this failed to disperse the crowd, police opened fire with live rounds on the protestors.

Hospital officials have confirmed five were killed, including the son of a Meshrano Jirga (Upper House of Parlia-

ment) senator.

At least 15 people were wounded – most of whom were shot in the legs and feet, hospital officials confirmed. However, two of those killed were shot in the cheet.

Eventually the Afghan National Army was brought in to control the situation and they managed to push back the demonstrators.

The angry protestors took possession of the bodies from hospital authorities they continued to chant slogans including "Down with (President Ashraf) Ghani." (Tolonews)

Embassy Charge d'Affaires Dr. Ulrich Ernst, NATO Senior Civilian Representative Cornelius Zimmerman and Resolute Support Chief of Staff Lt. Gen. Jurgen Weigt. The German Embassy is one of the locations most affected by the detonation.

should change this type of security into a security which is maintained by using technological capabilities plus human capacity. It is needed for all over the (Kabul) city," said Mirza Mohammad Yarmand, former deputy minister of interior.

"This shows the weakness, failure and irresponsibility of security forces and in general of our government," said Assadullah Saadati, MP.

Meanwhile, military analysts slammed security institutions, the National Security Council and the National Directorate of Security for having failed to safeguard security in the city and said all bodies need to apologize to the public and leaders need to resign.

"Government leaders should apologize from the people and should say that they cannot carry on. This is either their guts, their duty, their courage and it is the best option on the ground," said Atiqullah Amarkhail, a former military official.

senior director for health nutrition and population at the World Bank said in Kabul on Thursday: "The progress made in Afghanistan is impressive, especially given the serious security situation the country has faced over the last decade.

"Afghanistan has set a new benchmark against which to judge other countries affected by conflict, and even more so low income countries that are not facing conflict," Dr. Timothy Evans said at a Presidential Summit on Health Care in Afghanistan.

The number of functioning health facilities increased five-fold over while the proportion of facilities with female staff increased from 22 percent to 87 percent, according to review/

It also noted the government's contracting of NGOs to provide health services has led to improvements in coverage and quality, even in provinces that had high levels of conflict.

The Turkish foreign ministry in a

statement called the attack as heinous crime and conveyed condolences to the government and people of Afghanistan.

"Turkey will continue to stand with friendly and brotherly people and Government of Afghanistan in the fight against terrorism," the statement said.

Bill Shorten, leader of the Opposition in the Parliament of Australia, told Thursday's session that the Prime Minister had dealt with some of the terrible details of the incident and the terrible toll of human life.

He said some foreigners suffered injuries, including American and German embassy staff, but those murdered were overwhelmingly Afghan citizens and followers of the Islamic faith. "I don't know if they conformed to every single letter and tenet of their religion, few people of any faith ever do. But I suspect they were very good Muslims, doing their best to be good parents, good citizens, good people," he said.

"At the beginning of this most holy time in the Islamic faith, this act of terror is a crime against Islam, and a crime against humanity," he added. In his cable, Saudi King Abdullah Bin Abdulaziz Al Saud said: "We have received with profound pain and sadness the news of a terrorist explosion that took place in the diplomatic quarter in Kabul, killing and injuring

Meanwhile, Crown Prince of Abu Dhabi and Deputy Supreme Commander of the UAE Armed Forces Sheikh Mohamed bin Zayed Al Nahyan made a telephone call to President Chani

During the conversation, Mohamed voiced his strong condemnation of the "heinous terrorist attack" that took place in Wazir Akbar Khan area.

Mohamed said the UAE's stand with Afghanistan at this delicate time of confronting terrorism, and reiterated UAE's firm position in rejection of terrorism in all its forms and manifestations

Iranian Parliament Speaker Ali Larijani said that Iran would continue support for Afghan people and government in fighting terrorism and establishing security and peace there.

In separate messages to Afghan Parliament Speaker Abdul Raouf Ibrahimi and the Senate Speaker Fazl Hadi Muslimyar, the Iranian speaker condemned the attack, adding that Iran will spare no effort help the Afghan nation.

Terrorism and extremism are big threats to peace and stability in the globe, Larijani added.

The speaker expressed solidarity with people and government of Afghanistan as well as the bereaved families of the victims. (Agencies)

"With consideration of scale of the attack, perhaps at least 20 other people are missing, maybe they are mutilated or burnt completely," said Mohammed Salim Rasuli, head of MoPH hos-

pital. Zabi is one relative who is still searching for the bodies of his uncle and three colleagues who are believed to have been caught up in the explosion. "We searched all hospitals in Kabul and got nothing so far, finally we came to the incident site to get information from the police," said Zabi. Meanwhile, the Ministry of Interior (MoI) said that recovery operations by experts were still underway on Thurs-

day.
"We are prepared, our health teams are supporting in this respect according to their abilities," said Najib Danish, spokesman to MoI.

Officials from the Public Health Ministry have said that the majority of those wounded in the explosion were transferred to Kabul's Emergency Hospital, Wazir Akbar Khan Hospital and Jamhuriat Hospital.

According to the MoPH, of the total injured that were taken to hospitals, 100 were taken to the Emergency Hospital, 210 to Wazir Akbar Khan Hospital, 80 to Jamhuriat Hospital, 35 to Ibn-e-Sina hospital and 60 to the NDS hospital. Initially the majority of bodies were transferred to Wazir Akbar Khan Hospital, but later, 60 bodies were transferred from Wazir Akbar Khan Hospital and 15 from Sardar Daud military hospital to the Forensic Hospital. (Later, the president once again expressed his condolences to the victims' kin and ordered security organs to comprehensively investigate the attack and take serious steps for improvement of public security.

Ghani also ordered security officials to share details of the attack with the public. The president ordered MoUD and municipality officials to reconstruct all areas damaged in Wednesday's powerful explosion.

According to the Ministry of Public Health, 80 civilians were killed and 450 others wounded in the truck suicide bombing close to Zanbaq Square in the limits of the 10th police district. (Pajhwok)

A number of families who were waiting for to collect the bodies of their relatives outside the hospital said despite recovery efforts the remains of their loved ones were still missing.

"We searched all hospitals in Kabul," said Sardar, a relative of Mohammad Zafar, a security guard, who was believed killed in Wednesday's attack. Another family, who came to Kabul from Baghlan, said their son had been working as a security guard at the German Embassy in Kabul.

They said his body cannot be completely identified as it was completely dismembered in the explosion.

Kadija, a resident of Kabul, says her husband had been working for Ariana Airlines and was on his way to work when the explosion took place. She has had no word on his whereabouts since then.

"He was working as an engineer installing antennas in Faryab, Herat and other provinces. I am searching for him, no one says where he is," she said.

Another woman at the hospital said she is searching for her 14-year-old son who was working as an assistant driver for a private organization.

Head of Wazir Akbar Khan Hospital, Gul Ahmad Ayubi, said a number of bodies are not identifiable.

"The ceiling had collapsed on her. Her face was pressured. She was brought here this (Thursday) morning," he said.

Zabi, who has worked in the mortuary at the hospital for 20 years, said the body of a woman, killed in the deadly bombing on Wednesday, was brought to the hospital on Thursday.

"The emergency wards for women and men were full and we had to send emergency patients to other departments. We had to evacuate a number of patients who were partially in a good condition," he said.

Wazir Akbar Khan hospital has 30 trolleys, four ambulances and 100 medical doctors.

Doctors at the hospital said at least 24 surgeons were busy in surgery right through Wednesday night in a bid to help those wounded in the bombing. Experts say Wednesday's attack was one of the most deadliest incidents in Kabul in the past few years. (Tolone-

how long with they (NUG leaders) think only of power? Let the youths like us who have been suffering lead the country because they do not think of power," she added.

"I am proud of the security forces who are bravely defending their people and land, but administrative corruption, illegal mining and unemployment are the reasons for the prolonged war," he remarked.

Paktika Governor Elyas Wahdat also appreciated the security forces but stressed they should be equipped with advanced weapons. He said the Taliban were unable to fight face to face with the Afghan forces.

"Paktika is a surrounded province where three routes lead, including the one in Zurmat and another in the Andar town of Ghazni. But both routes are controlled by Taliban who stop people.

"Air transportation is another way but the shortage of helicopters makes this option less feasible," he explained.

Khost Governor Hakam Khan Habibi stressed the need for strict control of the Durand Line and good governance, saying security in the southeastern zone could be boosted if the routes frequented by militants were closed.

"Let's use strategic methods and block the ways the terrorists are using for their movements; there may be need for some security personnel but it will make other forces to feel safe," he remarked.

Brig. Gen. Abdul Wase Milad, commander of the 203rd Thunder Military Corps, after hearing suggestions from the governors, promised to implement their decisions.

He said security forces had tightened control on the Durand Line and other routes used by militant groups. Milad assured Elyas Wahdat one of the two routes would be secured for safe transportation.

The governors said lack of development projects and weak local governance were the reason for the increasing distance between the people and the government. They agreed to meet on security and civil services every three months. (Pajhwok)
