

13 Insurgents Killed in ANSF Military Operations

KABUL - At least 13 insurgents have been killed and seven others injured in a series of coordinated operations over the past 24 hours by the Afghan National Security Forces (ANSF), the Ministry of Interior (MoI) said in a statement on Sunday.

The operations were conducted in Kandahar, Uruzgan, Ghazni, Khost, Paktika, Paktiya, Badghis and Helmand provinces, the statement said. "Also, during these operations, Afghan National Security Forces discovered and confiscated light and heavy rounds of ammunition," it said. The MoI, however, did not comment on whether any



security force members were injured during the operations. (Tolonews)

3 Insurgents Killed While Planting Bomb

KANDAHAR CITY - Three militants have been killed while planting a roadside bomb on public way in southern Kandahar province. Officials say the three rebels were busy planting a roadside bomb that exploded on them in Dabibank area of Maiwand District last night. The incident comes a day after a roadside bomb blast claimed six lives in Kandahar's Shah Wali Kot District.

A civilian vehicle ran over a planted roadside bomb in Taghrook area leaving six members of a single family killed on Friday. According to a UN report published earlier the civilian casualties have increased by 16 percent... (More on P4)... (20)

12 Militants Killed in Kandahar Clash, Blasts

KANDAHAR CITY - A dozen Taliban militants have been killed and seven civilians wounded during separate incidents in southern Kandahar province, an official said on Sunday. Six militants were killed during an operation by security forces in the Shah Walikot district, said Zia Durrani, the provincial police spokesman.



He said the militants were planning to launch attacks on police posts, but police preempted the plot, killing six militants and seizing ammunition and explosives. Another six militants were killed in two separate explosions caused by their own... (More on P4)... (19)

Taliban Shadow District Governor Killed in Paktika

SHARAN - Security forces have killed a shadow district governor of Taliban in Paktika province. Nabiullah Peerkhil, spokesman for the governor of Paktika told Khaama Press that Ajab Khan alias Bilal who was Taliban's governor for Mata Khan District was killed during a military operation on Saturday morning. He said that



operation was jointly conducted by Afghan National Army and Afghan National Police in

Landizo area of Mata Khan District. Peerkhil further said that a colleague of Ajab Khan was also gunned down by the security forces and a PK machine gun, Kalashnikov and motorcycle was also confiscated by the security forces during this operation. He said security forces did not suffer casualties in the operation. (KP)

I. General Introduction:

The National Solidarity Program is the largest of the Afghanistan Government's national priority programmes and is the second largest development programme in the world. The Program is implemented by the Afghanistan Ministry of Rural Rehabilitation and Development (MRRD) and currently into its 9th year and 3rd phase. NSP consists of four core elements:

- Facilitation at the community level to assist communities establish inclusive community institutions known as Community Development Councils (CDCs);
- Building the capacities of CDC and community members;
- Providing direct block grant transfers to fund approved subprojects; and
- Linking CDCs to government agencies, NGOs, and donors to improve access to services and resources.

II. Introduction to the NSP's Monitoring and Evaluation Department (M&ED)

The M&ED exists to ensure that the NSP is able to monitor and report against the NSP III's overall objective and the intermediate objectives as stated in the Results Framework (RF). It is set up to respond to all qualitative reporting for the NSP, from both internally handled and externally contracted monitoring activities, evaluations and studies. Its primary functions includes the following:

- Design the monitoring tools to collect the required data to respond to the RF indicators, monitor field implementation quality and adherence to program and operational policies.
- Train field level monitors in the use of the forms and the data collection methodology.
- Train FP staff in the establishment and training of Community Participatory Monitoring (CPM) teams.
- Compile, analyze and report on the monitoring reports from the field at the national level.
- Assist the management and relevant departments to ensure various levels of data collection to respond to the varied NSP stakeholder reporting requirements.
- Analyze trends, deviations from policy, challenges, lessons learned from NSP field implementation and support management in the revision or updating of select policies or procedural guidelines/ requirements.
- Support the NSP management in procuring consultants and reviewing their outputs for NSP's externally contracted evaluations/studies.

III. Specific Roles/ Responsibilities Expected of the Consultant Position:

- Prepare and submit timely and accurate quarterly progress reports against the NSP III's Results Framework (RF).
- Oversee the compilation of data, data analyses and report preparation for the quarterly NSP monitoring report, and ensure its timely and accurate release.

Education: At a minimum, a bachelor's degree in Rural Development, Social Sciences, Project Management and/or related fields is required. Bachelor's degrees in other fields may also be considered if the work experience requirements are fully met. A Master's degree would be preferable.

Work Experience: A minimum of 4 years of work experience at mid or senior levels in large development programs is required. A minimum of 3 years of direct work experience in M&E is required. A minimum of 1 year of direct work experience in Government/ donor offices is required.


