

Dreaded Commanders among 28 Rebels Killed in Helmand

LASHKARGAH - Twenty-eight Taliban, including five notorious commanders, has been killed and 16 others wounded in an airstrike in southern Helmand province, an official said on Tuesday. Capt. Shakil Ahmad Tasal, deputy spokesman for the 203rd Maiwand Military Corps, told Pajhwok Afghan News the dead Taliban commanders were Mullah Raqeeb, Qari Omer, Firdosi, Jahadullah,



and Bashir Agha. The air raid took place in the Bajaji locality of Lashkargah, the provincial capital, late on Tuesday. Tasal said the Taliban had gathered in the area to plan attacks on security forces, but they

were eliminated in the raid. Meanwhile, the governor's office said it was unaware of the air raids killing the Taliban. But Defence Ministry officials confirmed the strikes on in Helmand. The Taliban, without commenting on the Lashkargah airstrike, claimed in a statement on the group's website that several policemen had been killed and wounded in Kajaki district. Separately, ... HERAT CITY - A 70-year-old man, who lost his two sons to an improvised explosive device (IED) blast in western Herat province, says life has since been a burden and no one has assisted him during his life's difficult days. Rebel forces in Afghanistan started using the IEDs against former USSR forces who

LOGAR - A key Haqqani Network terrorist has been arrested during an operation by the Afghan intelligence operatives in central Logar province of Afghanistan. The National Directorate of Security (NDS) said Sardar was an active member of the Haqqani terrorist network who was a skilled producer of Improvised Explosive Device (IED). NDS further added that Sardar was acting directly on instructions of Mawlawi Salim, a Haqqani terrorist network commander, to plant IEDs and coordinate terrorist attacks. 3 Members of a Family Gunned Down in Faryab

MAIMANA - Three member of a family have been killed by a Taliban-linked relative in the Khwaja Sabzposh district of north western Faryab province, an official said on Tuesday. District chief, Abdullah Masoomi, told Pajhwok Afghan News the overnight shooting took place in the Kosa Qala locality of the town at 11:00pm. Eng. Abdul Haq, a former foreign NGO worker, his wife and their 5-year son were gunned down by Habibullah, brother of his spouse and member of the Taliban movement. Masoomi linked the incident to family tensions. Abdul Haq had divorced his first wife some years back. Habibullah, his brother-in-law, had since been angry with Haq. Three other children of Abdul Haq -- aged between one to four years -- were shell-shocked by the killing of their parents, the official said. Habibullah, who joined the Taliban five months back, is heading a rebel group. A local resident said Haq worked as a technical assistant for a foreign organization, but for the past one month he worked in a shop and manufactured and repaired electronic transformers. (Pajhwok)

German Accused of Having Taliban Ties Goes on Trial

BERLIN - A 27-year-old man went on trial in Berlin on Monday accused of membership of the German Taliban Mujahideen (DTM) organization, Reuters reported. Sinan A. is believed to have travelled to the border region between Afghanistan and Pakistan in September 2009, where he is suspected to have joined the organisation and fought against NATO-led International Security Assistance Force (ISAF) soldiers. According to judge and Tiergarten District Court's spokeswoman Lisa Jani,



although the defendant's suspected actions happened outside of Germany, German law states that he can still be prosecuted for them at home, reported Reuters.

Local Customs a Barrier for Girls to Higher Education

KANDAHAR - "The main obstacle on our way to get higher education is the indecent traditions against women and illogical culture of families that opposing education for girls," 16-year-old girl student Khatira said. Studying in grade nine in Zarghona Ana Girl School in the southern Kandahar city, 450 km south of Kabul, Khatira lamented that many families don't like their daughters to get higher education. According to Khatira, many families regard getting higher education by girls in the southern region of Afghanistan as "stigma" and many parents tie the knot for their girls when they are in grade nine or



block them from farther schooling. "Although my family has no opposition to my study, I am afraid that living in the traditional environment can influence my parents one day to stop me from going to school," Khatira said. The residents of Kandahar and the neighboring Helmand, Zabul and Uruzgan provinces in south Afghanistan, where Taliban militants are active, deeply believe in tribal traditions and mostly prefer women to stay at home. ... Married Woman Shot Dead for Eloping with a Man in Ghor Province

GHOR - A married woman was reportedly shot dead by relatives as she was attempting to elope with a man in western Ghor province of Afghanistan. A local official said the woman has been identified as Aziz Gul and was shot dead by relatives late on Monday night in Ahangaran area. The official further added that the woman was arrested as she was trying to elope and was shot dead by the relatives of her husband. No one has been arrested in connection to the murder of the women so far, the official added. This comes as a number of cases involving brutal murder of the women have

been reported in various provinces during the recent months. A teenage girl was burnt alive by her brother's wife in eastern Nangarhar province of Afghanistan earlier last month, while three sisters were shot dead, allegedly by the militants in Logar province earlier this week. ... 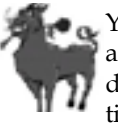

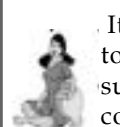
