

15 IS Militants Killed in Eastern Afghan Airstrikes

JALALABAD - Some 15 militants of the Islamic State (IS) group were killed as a U.S. pilotless plane attacked their position in Nangarhar overnight, the provincial government said on Monday. "Acting upon confirmed intelligence reports, the pilotless plane of the coalition forces stormed a hideout of IS militants in Mohmand Dara area of Achin district last night, killing 15 IS militants and destroying their weapons and ammunition," it said in a statement. The district bordering Pakistan has been the scene of heavy clashes between IS militants



and security forces, backed by pro-government local militiamen over the past couple of months. The militant group has yet to make comments. In an unrelated incident, six Taliban militants had been killed and seven others wounded after security forces repelled an attack on three villages in Darqad district of northern Takhar province, provincial police spokesman, Abdul Khalil Asir, told Xinhua on Monday. Female Convicts Handed Over to Tribal Elders in Paktika

SHARAN - Some women accused of committing different crimes in south-eastern Paktika province remain unpunished and have been handed over to tribal elders after their conviction due to non-availability of a separate prison for females. Asadullah Wazir, the provincial appellant attorney, told Pajhwok Afghan News there was no separate prison for women in Paktika and female convicts were handed over to tribal elders. "Prison is a place where criminals reform them-

selves, but we don't have a prison for women in the province and we transfer female criminals to tribal elders or to their families against guarantee which had no positive results." Yaqoub Khan, the head of a youth organization in Paktika, said female criminals remained unpunished as there was no prison for them and it was a reason behind the increase in crime ratio. Afghan Battle Claims 32 Lives Including 19 Militants

KABUL - Afghan militancy and counter-militancy have claimed the lives of 32 people including 19 armed insurgents and 13 security personnel across the conflict-ridden country over the past 24 hours, officials confirmed Monday. Up to 14 Taliban militants have been killed as clash erupted in Kajaki district of the southern Helmand province on Monday, an army spokesman in the restive province, Mohammad Rasoul Zazai said. A group of Taliban militants, according to the official stormed security checkpoints in Kajaki district early morning triggering gun battle, which

had left 14 armed fighters dead. Seventeen more militants have sustained injuries during fighting which is continuing sporadically, the official asserted. Mantine, Afghan Defense ministry in a statement released here Monday reported killing 19 anti-government militants including 14 Taliban fighters in the troubled Helmand province, two others in the eastern Ghazni and three more militants loyal to the so-called Islamic State (IS) in the eastern Nangarhar province over the past 24 hours. Defense Ministry in the statement also confirmed that 13 security personnel had

been killed in fighting against militants elsewhere in the militancy-hit country over the past 24 hours. Taliban militants who are active in parts of the country and have been fighting in several provinces to regain power, haven't commented on the claim made by government. Fighters loyal to the Islamic State haven't commented either. Taliban militants, according to Afghan observers, have speeded up activities ahead of the proposed direct talks with Afghan government to discuss peace and national reconciliation expected to be held in Pakistan within week. Two Killed in Clash on Afghan-Tajik Border

KABUL - Tajik border guards have been engaged in a firefight with a small group of militants trying to enter the country from Afghanistan, the authorities said on Monday, with losses on both sides. Nine armed militants tried to cross the border near the Panj border post on Saturday, the State Security Committee said in a statement, but were noticed by Tajik servicemen who killed one intruder in an ensuing gunfight. One Tajik border guard has also died from heavy wounds and others were still chasing the remaining militants on Monday. The committee described the militants as a terrorist group, making the incident distinct from regular clashes with drug smugglers on the same border. Tajik security services said in January that as many as 5,000 militants from Taliban and other Islamist groups had amassed near its 1,344 km (835 mile) border with Afghanistan. Russia has a military base in the former Soviet republic, which has a population of 9 million. But it pulled some of its troops away from the border to capital Dushanbe last December and said last month it would downsize the base. (Reuters)

8 Illegal Afghans Detained in Peshawar Operation

PESHAWAR - Eight Afghan citizens have been apprehended during door-to-door search operations in Pakistan's northwestern city of Peshawar, a security official said on Monday. A police officer confided to Pajhwok security forces netted the illegal foreigners in Hayatabad and Faqirabad areas of Peshawar, capital of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province, on Sunday. At least 150 houses were searched during the operations, involving policewomen and personnel from different law-enforcement agencies, said the official, who requested not to be named. Hundreds of Goshta Families Displaced by Cross-Border Shelling

JALALABAD - At least 300 families have been displaced due to an exchange of fire between Afghan and Pakistani security forces in the Goshta district of eastern Nangarhar province, an official said on Monday. Brig. Gen. Wali Khan Shinwari, commander of the 301st border police force, told Pajhwok Afghan News Pakistani security forces had been firing at different villages in the district for a month. On Sunday, fire erupted across Durand Line in Goshta after the Pakistani border guards attacked Anar-



ki area, a public representative claimed. The Afghans responded to the shelling from the Pakistani guards, who used light and heavy weapons, including artillery fire.

Attaullah Khogyani, the governor spokesman, confirmed the cross-border clash to Afghan media. However, he had no more information regarding the incident. (Pajhwok)

NDS Seized 680 KG Drugs, Explosives in Logar

KABUL - The National Directorate of Security (NDS) - Afghanistan's intelligence agency has seized drugs and a weapon depot of militants during a raid in central Logar province of Afghanistan. Officials said
