Key Taliban Group Leader Abdul Wali Killed in Laghman Province

KABUL - A key leader of the Taliban group identified as Abdul Wali was killed during clashes with the security forces in eastern Laghman province.

The provincial government media office in a statement said Wali was killed during the clashes between the Afghan forces and Taliban insurgents in Alishen district. The statement further added that the clashes took place late on Saturday afternoon in the vicinity of Kotali area. Wali was involved in a number major terrorist attacks in various parts of Laghman province, the provincial



government said, adding that his dead body was left for several hours in the battlefield after the remaining insurgents fled the area. The provincial government also added that sporadic clashes had taken place in other parts of the provincial capital on Saturday evening which left at least three militants dead or wounded. Laghman has been among the relatively calm provinces since the fall of the Taliban regime in 2001 but the anti-government armed militant groups have increased their insurgency in some parts of the province during the recent years. Man Kills Wife over Talking on Phone in Jawzjan

SHIBERGHAN - A man strangled to death his 25-year-old wife in Shiberghan, the capital of northern Jawzjan province, local authorities said on Monday.

The governor's spokesman, Mohammad Raza Ghafori, said the victim was choked to death by her spouse using her scarf in Islamjoy locality of the city late on Sunday. "The accused after killing his wife wanted to escape but security forces arrested him. The motive behind the murder is not yet clear".

The victim's body had been taken to hospital for postmortem and security forces had initiated their investigation into the incident, Ghafori said.

A relative of the slain woman, who wished to remain anonymous, said yesterday evening when her husband came home, his wife was talking to someone on the telephone.

"The husband was angry and first verbally clashed with her and eventually choked her with a scarf. The woman was a mother of four children".

Dr. Faridon Momand, Jawzjan's public health director, said doctors who examined the woman's body had found scratches around her neck. "There were no other signs of torture on her body which was handed over to her relatives after completion of the examination". ...(More on P4)...(16)

26 Insurgents Killed in Counter-**Terrorism Operations**

KABUL - At least 26 insurgents were killed in counter-terrorism operations carried out by Afghan forces in different parts of the country in past 24 hours, the Ministry of Interior (MoI) said in a statement on Monday. The statement said 11 other insurgents were wounded in the operations.

"The operations were conducted in Baghlan-e-Markazi district of Baghlan, Nish district of Kandahar and Lashkargah, the capital city of Helmand province," the statement said.

"Also, during these operations, the forces seized two rocket launchers with seven rockets,



one machine gun, one AK-47 rifle and 15 different types of IEDs," the statement added.

The statement did not provide more details about operations.

Panjsher Police Recover 700kg of Drugs

PARAKH - Twenty-five people have been arrested by police in central Panjsher province in connecting with smuggling drugs amounting to 700 kilograms, an official said on Sunday.

Col. Najmuddin, deputy provincial police chief, said of the detainees four carried 500kgs of raw hashish. They were arrested while crossing a check post in Dalan Sanga area of Shatal district on Saturday. The smugglers had skillfully placed the drugs in a Surf model car
