

President Hopeful of Lasting Peace in New Year

KABUL - President Mohammad Ashraf Ghani on Thursday termed the new solar year as year of peace and said the government wanted a durable peace not the one which is vulnerable to further bloodshed.

Addressing a gathering in Mazar-i-Sharif, the capital of northern Balkh province, marking the New Year's celebration the president said peace was as important as oxygen for Afghani-

Referring to the development in Afghanistan he said: "We want a durable peace in Afghanistan not the one which may threaten instability in the

The president showed respect to the decision of the Independent Election Commission (IEC) regarding delay in the presidential election but at the same time stressed on no further delay

"Poverty in Afghanistan is not acceptable for me. I don't want to be the president in Afghanistan where few are milliner while most are living under the poverty line." (Pajhwok)



Farmer's Day; Minister Vows to Develop Agriculture



KABUL - A large number of farmers, producers, investors and government officials attended the Farmer's Day ceremony in Kabul on Friday where the Minister of Agriculture, Irrigation and Livestock, Nasir Ahmad Durrani, vowed to build infrastructures for the sector and move it towards mechanization.

Durrani said work on construction of three big silos and cereal storages will kick off in the near fu-

He promised that required support will be provided to those investors who are interested to invest in processing and packaging of fruits and vegetables as well as in establishing poultry and fishing farms.

"In addition to technical assistance, we will provide financial support to those who will invest in different areas of agriculture sector," said Dur-

Mohammad Yaqub, the governor of Kabul, stressed the need for use of domestic products and said there is a need for more support to the country's farmers.

"Government should implement more plans for promoting standard cultivation and marketing for domestic products," said Haidari.

UAE's Crown Prince 'Proposed Killing Taliban Leaders': Report

ABU DHABI - Mohammed bin Zayed, the UAE's crown prince, proposed to set up an assassination program targeting top Taliban leaders during a meeting with the US Secretary of State Mike Pompeo earlier this year, the Middle East Eye (MEE) news website has reported.

The crown prince made the offer during Pompeo's visit to the UAE on January 12 amid disagreements over the progress of peace talks between US and Taliban negotiators, MEE reported on Thursday, citing to a source with detailed knowledge of the

According to the report, bin Zayed told Pompeo that Washington risked allowing Afghanistan to fall back into the hands of the "backward, bearded bad guys" and proposed hiring mercenaries to kill Taliban leaders to weaken the group's negotiating

Pompeo was visibly taken aback by the offer, but said nothing, the report said.

The UAE has supported US efforts to broker a peace deal with the Taliban and hosted the first round of negotiations between the two sides late last year in Abu Dhabi.

But according to Al Jazeera news agency, bin Zayed is believed to have been frustrated that subsequent rounds of negotiations were moved to Qatar's capital, Doha, at the insistence of the Taliban, which has maintained a political office there

In January, US and Taliban negotiators held a sixday meeting - which was described by Pompeo on Twitter as "encouraging" - in Doha, which also hosted marathon talks over 16 days in February and March.

According to MEE's source, bin Zayed warned Pompeo that withdrawing US forces from Afghanistan risked a regression back to 2001, prior to the US-led invasion that overthrew the Taliban government in Kabul. ...(More on P4)...(10)

Explosions in Kabul Leave Six Dead




KABUL - The Ministry of Interior said on Thursday that six people were killed and 23 others were wounded in three explosions near a Nawroz celebration ceremony in

According to the ministry, the explosions happened in Kabul's PD3 near Kart-e-Sakhi, where people had gathered to celebrate the first day of

Interior Ministry spokesman Nusrat Rahimi said the explosives were placed at the area ahead of Nawroz. 
