were brought down from billboards in Mazar-i-Sharif, the capital of northern Balkh province, on the new year's night. Some protesters had accused men linked to the governor of Balkh of having hand in the move. However, Noor had rejected the assertion amid protests by his supporters. Meanwhile, Noor on his Facebook page said their silence did not mean they were afraid and Dostum wrote the protests spilled over to other provinces after the Balkh leadership failed to respond to people's demands.

Noor said he had asked his supporters to be calm. "But those who insult us on a daily basis and even throw fires in front of our people think our silence is because we're afraid." The governor said he had advised the people of Kabul and Kohdaman to be patient and the brave people of the north to be calm.

Dostum on his Facebook wall urged his supporters to give time to the central and local governments to respond to their demands and call off protests until they received a positive response.

Noor said the peoples living in the laps of Hindu Kush mountains, Panjsher, Loye Kandahar, Kunar, Helmand, Khost, Paktia, Paktika and the entire people of the north and the northeast were awaiting his response to the protests and were expecting the "conspiracy" to be thwarted, otherwise they would also arise.

He said his supporters were expecting the Balkh leadership would take urgent measures to address people's concerns, but the delay in doing so expanded the protests to other provinces. He said it was people's right to take forwards their complaints through protests and in an independent way.

Dostum asked his followers to be clam while pursuing their demands and said Afghanistan at the moment needed brotherhood, peace and stability and urged the Afghans to stay firm on the path to peace and stability. (Pajhwok)

3) United Nations Mine Action Service (UNMAS) - USD 2,000,000 Funding from the Government of Japan will support demining activities in Kandahar, Kunduz, and Farah provinces, where many communities remain affected by landmines and explosive remnants of war (ERW). It is expected that a total of 1.76 square kilometres of land will be cleared of landmines and ERW, directly benefitting 13,198 people who reside within 500 meters from contaminated areas, with indirect beneficiaries estimated at 456,885. The assistance will contribute to socio-economic development as well as an overall reduction of civilian casualties.

Similarly, WFP has received \$8,000,000 for addressing the issue of food insecurity and malnutrition

and providing humanitarian air services.

WFP will procure, transport and distribute over 6,850 metric tonnes of food to about 100,000 vulnerable people for two to nine months.

In addition, it will operate air transportation services for passengers and cargos to facilitate humanitarian and development activities in Afghanistan, including timely medical and security evacuation as required. IOM has been given \$5,000,000 to help provide humanitarian assistance to 26,720 highly vulnerable undocumented Afghan returnees from Pakistan and Iran. The project will establish and pilot a reintegration tracking mechanism for vulnerable returnees in Kabul, Nangarhar, Herat, Nimroz, Khost and Paktika.

The contribution will help facilitate the return of 65 highly qualified Afghans from Iran, 35% expected to be female, to work in and transfer their skills to public institutions in Kabul. (Pajhwok)

In the new Population Movements Bulletin, Bowden highlights several significant developments:

- The massive population movement in recent months is complex in nature, with ambiguity about places of origin, making consideration of returns complicated without careful analysis;

- Afghan population movement is not exclusively, nor even predominantly, a European issue;

- In addition to outward migration, internal displacement is a huge issue in Afghanistan;

- Concerns in European capitals are such that some are questioning sustaining their official development assistance to the countries perceived as sources of population movement.

The UN envoy also notes that the debate in Europe overlooks the fact that Iran and Pakistan have far greater numbers of Afghans - 950,000 in Iran and 1.4 million in Pakistan.

In addition to those who have left Afghanistan, there are estimated to be around 769,665 who have been displaced from their homes but remain in the country.

Bowden says continued support for Afghanistan "might be questioned, as countries receiving large numbers may find it necessary to use development assistance to support those people, rather than supporting efforts to strengthen the economy in Afghanistan and - hopefully - helping to address one of the causal factors." In a statement from the Presidential Palace, President Ghani insisted such violent acts were unacceptable and stressed "completely peaceful protest demonstrations" in line with the Constitution and said those restoring to violence were violating the Constitution.

The president said the armed clash involving illegal armed men during the protest was clear violation of the country's laws. He said the government not only wanted an end to the violence but it had directed security forces to deal with sternly with elements trying to take the law into their hands. (Pajhwok)

More than three-fourths of adults express dissatisfaction with the performance of the country's leadership: 81% say they are somewhat dissatisfied with the performance of the

national unity government.

According to the survey, 76% are somewhat dissatisfied with President Ashraf Ghani's performance, and 86% with Chief Executive Officer Abdullah Abdullah.

Asked about 10 selected countries and organisations, Afghans voiced their most favorable opinions of India (62% overall), followed at some distance by China (46% overall), Russia (39%) and Iran (37%).

Major western actors are viewed favourably by about a third of Afghans: both the UK and the US at 34%. NATO/ISAF is also seen positively by just under three in ten (28% overall).

Two in three (67%) Pashto speakers have an unfavourable view of the US, compared to 44% of Dari speakers and 32% of Uzbek speakers. (Pajhwok)
