

Foreigners 'Faking' Afghan Identity in Refugee Camps

KABUL - Afghan migrants revealed on Saturday that foreign nationals - particularly Iranian and Pakistani citizens - are registering themselves as Afghan, Iraqi or Syrian on their asylum application forms at refugee camps. This new development comes close to the heels of a decision by a number of European countries recently to only accept refugees from countries at war. "On route I saw several Iranian nationals registering their names as Afghan citizens and also Pakistani and Nepalese refu-



gees were registering their names as Iraqi and Syrian citizens," Afghan asylum seeker Mohammad Khalid said. "For the last two days the Serbian authorities they decided to have this new regulation that on the war affected countries can pass and these are the Syrians, Afghans and Iraqis, they are allowed to pass from the border and the same is also applied in the Greece Macedonia border," a UNHRC official Sida Kazoku said. Two Foreigners among Three Killed by Own Bomb in Nangarhar



KABUL - Three militants have been killed and another wounded by own bomb in Kot District of eastern Nangarhar province, officials said Sunday. Spokesman for Nangarhar police said that the bomb exploded when four militants were carrying a landmine to place it on roadside between Janjal Ghondi and Sayed Ahmaddkhal area. Colonel Hazrat Hussain Mashriqiwal adds that two of those killed were foreign nationals. This comes days after 22 dead bodies of Pakistani militants who were killed in Afghanistan returned to Pakistan. A local official Alam Zib said the killed insurgents belonged to al-Badar Mujahideen and Jamat-ud-Dawah armed groups. The dead bodies were buried in their ancestral grave yard in Lower Dir area of Pakistan's Khyber Pakhtunkhwa Province on Friday. Afghan government has been asking Pakistan to stop training terrorists and sending them to Afghanistan for its "undeclared war" but Pakistan turns them as allegations. (KP)

Iran's Border Police 'Shoot' Afghan Mother

KABUL - A nine member Afghan family, reportedly trying to enter Turkey through Iran, said on Sunday that one of the mothers in their group was shot dead by Iranian border police on Saturday in the Iranian city of Oromia. "My sister was killed while we were on our way to Turkey and now her three children are crying for her and no one is hearing our plight. We are extremely mistreated," the family's elder, Mohammad Alif, said. "We are now in the Iranian border city of Oromia. They [Iranian police] intend to seize our passports and deport us by land to Afghanistan," he said. This comes amid a mass exodus of Afghans through Iran to Turkey and on to Europe as they flee war-torn Afghanistan in search of a better life. Three decades of violence in the country has reportedly left more than five million Afghans displaced. Thousands have fled to Europe alone in recent months. Last week, Afghan Minister of Foreign Affairs Salahuddin Rabbani said that in the past year 146,000 Afghans have fled to Europe. However, an Afghan youth organization on Sunday launched an awareness campaign aimed at the youth, educating them on the negative consequences of illegal migration. "We launched a campaign to provide awareness to the people not leave the country, because fleeing does not solve the problem," campaign organizer Edris Stanikzai said. (Tolonews)

Taliban Trained 5-Year-Old Child for a Period of 6 Years for Suicide Mission

KABUL - Amid growing concerns regarding the use of children as child soldiers and suicide attacks by the anti-government armed militant groups, a shocking report has emerged regarding an 11-year-old child who was trained by the Taliban militants since he was only 5 for a suicide attack mission. The child, Rohullah, was abducted by the Taliban militants when he was only 5-year-old and since then has been trained on



how to carry out suicide attack. According to the local government officials in northern Kunduz province, Rohullah was abducted from Khanabad port and was kept in Imam Sahib district where he was being brain washed and trained regarding the suicide attacks. Four Insurgents Killed in Nuristan Clash: Border Officials



KABUL - At least four Pakistani insurgents were killed in a clash with security forces in eastern Nuristan province, local officials said on Sunday. In addition, three other insurgents were injured. The clash took place after insurgents allegedly crossed the Durand line and opened fire on border police, border police officials in Nuristan said. "The insurgents attacked the forces and were faced with a strong response from border police. Four of them were killed and three others injured," said officials. The officials said no casualties among border police or civilians had been incurred during the clash. (Tolonews)

GARDAIZ - The National Directorate of Security (NDS) has detained three important members of Haqqani terrorist network in Gardiz city, the capital of Paktia province. They are identified as Mustafa S/O Niaz Mohammad the bomb supplier who

KABUL - The National Directorate of Security (NDS) said Sunday that the so-called district governor of Taliban for Deh Sabz District of Kabul province has been killed. According to a statement released by NDS, Qari Muzamil alias Hakimullah was killed along with four of his men in Behsood District of eastern Nangarhar province. 
