Hamid Karzai "Global Consensus" Must in Fight Against Terrorism

KABUL - Former president Hamid Karzai has said that the world must build a "global consensus" on an inclusive security paradigm to address international security challenges, confront acts of terrorism and "eradicate its roots in sanctuaries."
"The challenge for all of us today is to move beyond zero sum games," Karzai added during his speech at the war on terror, terrorism and the impact on Muslim countries at the Emirates Centre for Strategic Studies and Research on Monday.
"The world must recognise that ex-



tremists and terrorists have carried out immense atrocities against Muslims around the world," he said. "They are instruments of distorting a peaceful religion and tainting the image of Islam and Muslims around the world."
Karzai also warned that terrorism is moving beyond the Muslim world and that larger international sincerity is required against the phenomenon.

Russia Hit 86 'Terrorist' Targets in Syria in Past 24 Hours: Military

MOSCOW - Russia's air force hit 86 "terrorist" targets in Syria in the past 24 hours, the defence ministry said Tuesday, in the highest one-day tally since it launched its bombing campaign on September 30.
"In the last 24 hours, Su-34, Su-24M and Su-25M planes carried out 88 sorties against 86 terrorist infrastructure targets in the provinces of Raqa, Hama, Idlib, Latakia and Aleppo," ... (More on P4)...(10)

Jihadi Leaders form Commission to Help Security

KABUL - A number of ex-Jihadi leaders and political parties have formed a council to help overcome challenges in war-ravaged Afghanistan. They have also formed a commission to discuss the participation of Jihadi forces (public forces) to help maintain security in the country.
The CEO's office meanwhile says it supports the cooperation of public forces for ensuring security in the country, but such decisions should be made in collaboration with security forces.



The former Jihadi leaders have named the council as the Council of Jihadi Leaders and Political Parties. They say that the council has a six-member commission that will talk with the National Unity Government (NUG) leaders aimed at discussing the security, economic and political challenges in the country.
