Military Solution to War in Afghanistan Ruled out

PESHAWAR - The ongoing conflict in Afghanistan cannot be resolved through military means alone, says a senior Pakistani military official.

Islamabad and Kabul would continue to work hard for peace in Afghanistan, the Joint Chiefs of Staff Committee (CJCSC) chairman told a London audi-

"Pakistan has tried and will try its best to partner with all forces towards reconciliation between various factions so that there is peace and stability inside Afghanistan," he said.

Gen. Zubair Mahmood Hayat warned outside formulas were unlikely to yield positive results and Afghanistan itself could best deal with its domestic problems.

The gathering was also attended by senior officers of the British armed forces and members of defence think-tanks, according to The News International.

"Pakistan has tried and will continue to try its best to partner with all forces towards reconciliation between various factions so that there is peace and stability in Afghanistan," he said.

Civilians Among 5 Killed in Nangarhar **Operation**

JALALABAD - Two Taliban commanders and three civilians have been killed in an Afghan Special Forces operation in Lalpora district of eastern Nangarhar province, an official said Sunday.

The operation was launched in Beli area of the district on Saturday night, Ghalib Mujahid, the district administrative chief told Pajhwok Afghan News.He said a Taliban commander, Liaqat and his deputy were killed when a house was raided by Afghan Special Forces. Three civilians were also killed and three militants injured in the incident, he added.

However, he said the civilians were killed in Taliban gunfire. Some of weapons belonged to the militants also destroyed in the operation.

Afghan forces suffered no casualties in militants' exchange of firing, Mujahid said. Taliban did not comment yet on the incident. (Pajhwok)

6 Suspects Detained in Kapisa Cleric Murder

MAHMOOD RAQI - Police have detained six suspects in connection with the killing of the Ulema Council chief for central Kapisa province, officials said on Sunday.

Qais Qaderi, the governor's spokesman, told Pajhwok Afghan News the security personnel made the arrests on Satyrday after the murder of Maulvi Gul Ahmad Hani-

He said three of the men were arrested moment after the incident and the rest in the afternoon. The detainees are currently being interrogated to find the killers.

On the other hand, police spokesman Mohammad Ayub Yousafzai said three suspects were arrested by police in Kohistan-2 district. Two of them are residents of Kohband and a third belongs to Kohistan.

Yasin, a resident of Kohistan 1, said most of the people had been traveling on motorcycles and carried weapons. He urged police to prevent them. (Pajhwok)

Illegal Armed Men **Destabilises Takhar: Residents**

TAKHAR - Illegal armed men in Taloqan, the capital of northern Takhar province and most of its districts have created problems for people and destabilized the local government, local residents said. Nasir Ahmad, a resident of Chahab district of the province, told Pajhwok Afghan News many irresponsible armed groups had been appeared in the province, who were harassing and killing people as well disrupting security situation.

Activities of such groups affects the sovereignty of the government and created security problems for the public, he said.

"Some of illegal armed gangs have built their own government in some areas, they are involved in killing people and looting as well as in internal disputes, they also hold trials about murder cases and kill those who violate their decisions," he said.

He said that many people had been killed as result of clashes between illegal armed groups and their increasing activities in the area. However, Ahmad did not name anyone.

Two Dangerous Gangs of Kidnappers and Robbers **Busted in Kabul City**



KABUL - Two dangerous gangs of kidnappers and robbers have been busted by the Afghan security forces in capital Kabul amid rising criminal incidents in Kabul city.


The Afghan Intelligence, National Directorate of Security (NDS), said the members of the gangs were arrested during separate operations conducted by the Afghan intelligence operatives in the city. A statement by NDS said the arrested individuals have been identified as Mohsin who was in lead of the gangs of kidnappers and armed robbers. The statement further added that the other indi-

viduals arrested during the operations have been identified as Abdul Qadir also famous as Khalid Dedana who was the deputy leader of the gangs, Imran Khan, Fawad also famous as Ramiz, Mohsin, and Noor Ahmad also famous as Bibi Mahro. NDS said the detained individuals have confessed that they were involved in several criminal incidents including the kidnapping of wealthy Kabul residents, armed robberies, and other criminal acts. This comes as incidents involving armed conflicts and other criminal incidents are on the rise in the key cities of the country including capital Kabul during the recent months.






