Pakistani Taliban Militants Shifting Over to ISIS: Janan Mosazai

KABUL - The Afghan ambassador to Pakistan Janan Mosazai said the militants of Tehrik-e-Taliban Pakistan (TTP) are shifting over to the Islamic State of Iraq and Syria (ISIS) terrorist group. Speaking during a seminar on Countering Violence Extremism, Mosazai insisted for regional cooperation to fight terrorist group, particularly the self-styled ISIS terror group. Mosazai said the region should have a common collective response against this common enemy, insisting that "there is no single country strategy or solution to the menace of terrorism today..."



filtrate into Nangarhar province and switch over to the black flag or Daesh, which we have been containing," Mosazai quoted by local media reports said. He also added that the terror group

was spreading "its propaganda and obscurantist worldview" also in Pakistan, similar as other parts of the world.

Mosazai warned that "Networks of terror have shown that they are fast, they are quick, they are better at coordination, communication and cooperation. On the contrary, states, including in this region, are still a lot slower. We have not developed and agreed upon a set of rules and mechanisms required to make our collective response and actions effective."
