Blast Victims Call for End to War on World Peace Day

KABUL - Marking International Peace Day, a number of demining organizations in Afghanistan on Monday called on insurgents to end the practice of laying landmines and other Improvised Explosive Devices (IEDs). The demining coordination center in Afghanistan also put out the call to end the tactic as most victims are civilians. According to Mohammad Wakil, the deputy head of mine action coordination center, children are all too often victims of mines. "On average 100 people die as a result of mine blasts or become disabled. We call on all warring parties to stop mining the country," he said.



At a ceremony to mark World Peace Day, anti-mining organization and victims of blasts gathered in Kabul on the Nadir Khan Hill where scores of children flew kites and painted pictures depicting peace. The aim was to send out a message to insurgents to stop their deadly tactics. One disabled child, who was a victim of an IED blast, said: "We want peace. Taliban come and reconcile with government so the war can come to an end." "We want peace. Peace will lead us to progress but war will destroy us," said Wahidul Rahman a deaf school student. ...*(More on P4)...(8)*

4-Year Plan for IDPs Being Implemented: Balkhi

KABUL - Refugee and Repatriation Minister Syed Hussain Alami Balkhi on Monday said a four-year plan was being implemented to resolve problems of more than one million internally displaced persons (IDPs). Balkhi told Pajhwok Afghan News the plan had two parts including the provision of shelter to the one million people. Under the plan, he said, some displaced families would be allotted residential plots and others facilitated in return to their original places. "We are trying to implement this plan with the help of the government and in cooperation with the displaced people and relevant donor organizations," he added.
